- Epstein's 6 types
 - Parenting
 - 2-way Communication
 - Instructional and support roles at school
 - Instructional and support roles at home
 - Decision Making
 - Connecting with the Community
- SEDL; kept Epstein's and added 2 more in 2005
 - Youth Development
 - Community Development
- California Parent Center; kept Epstein's and in 2005 added
 - Relationship building
- Parent-U-Turn; in 2006 kept Epstein's but combined 3 into one and added
 - Welcoming environment
 - Advocating for your child
 - Data collection and analysis
 - District level support structures to build parent capacity
- National PTA; had been the same as Epstein; in 2008 reissued; combined same 3 as Parent-U-Turn and added
 - Welcoming environment
 - Advocating for your child
- Joanne Martin; in 2009 kept Epstein's for parents and added categories for
 - School-initiated practices
 - Student-initiated practices
 - Community-initiated practices
