

COMMITTEE COMPOSITION

Advisory Committees should have a sufficient membership to be representative of the occupation taught. A committee of five to seven members is ideal. Title 5, 11504 (i) (1) indicates: “The majority of the committee membership shall represent the occupation for which instruction is given.” This is the legal reference to the size of the advisory committee.
