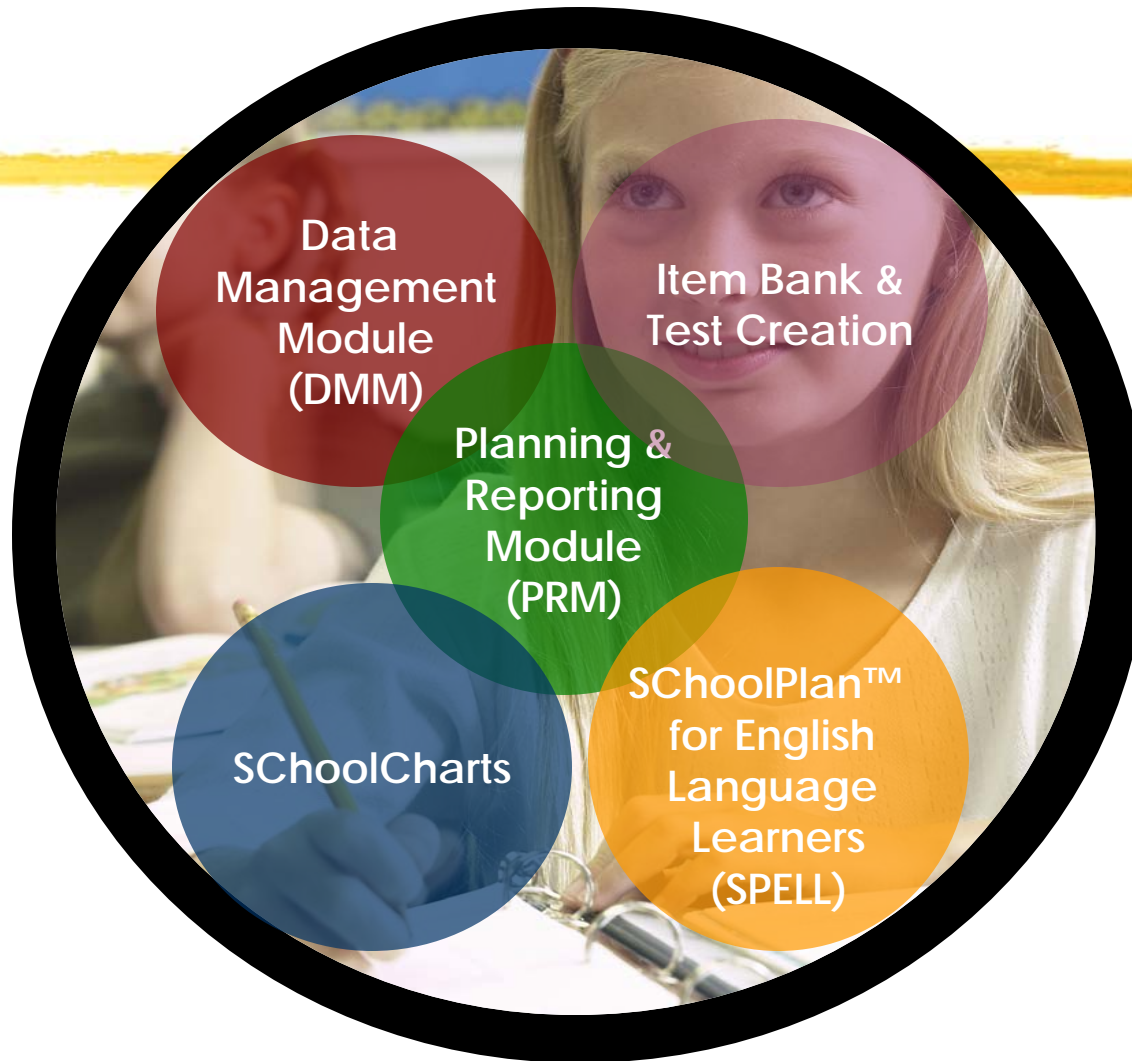

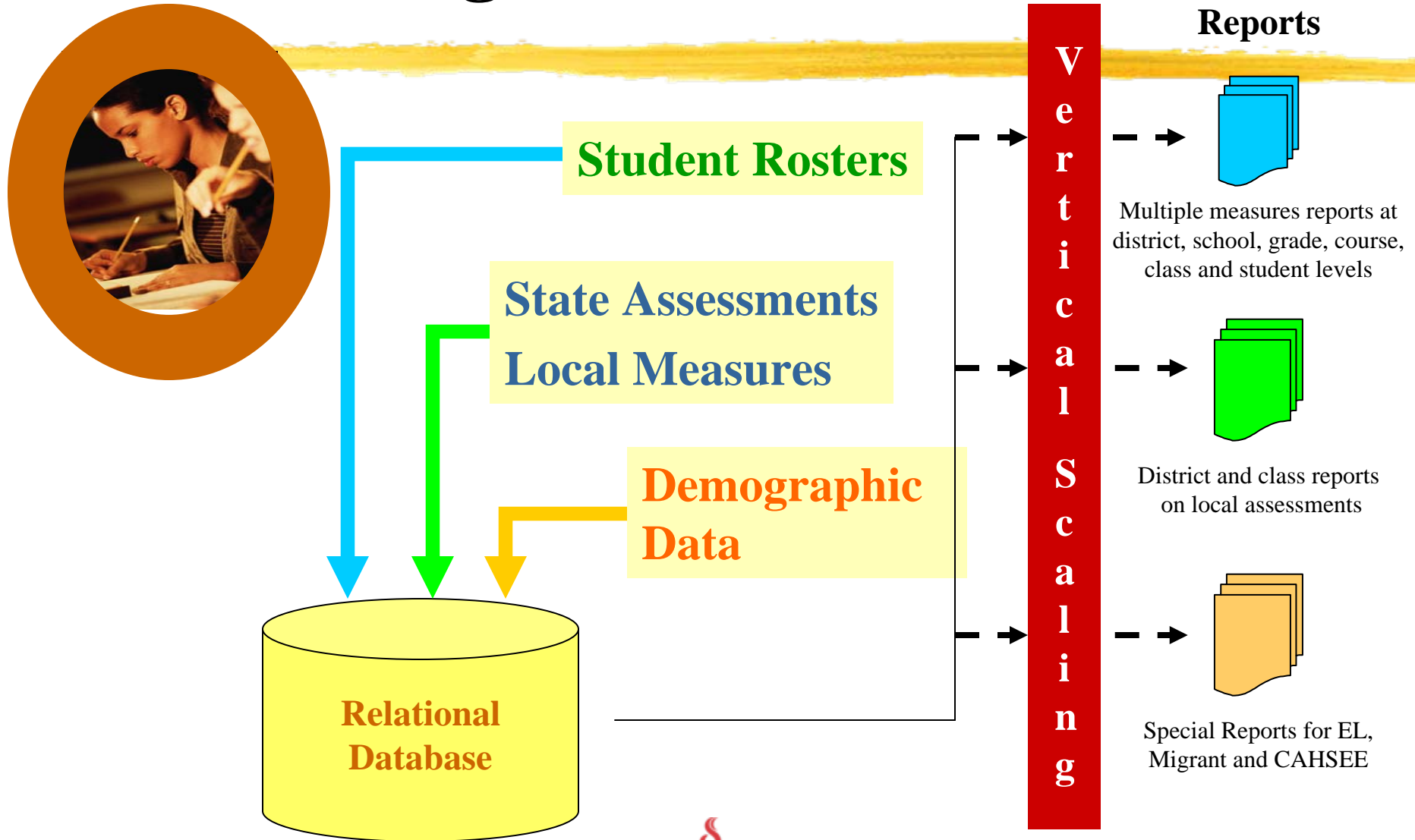
What is SChoolPlan™?

- ◆ An integrated system that supports districts and schools in making informed, effective, research-based and data driven decisions to improve student achievement

Guiding Principles:

- ◆ School improvement is the desired outcome - not the plan or reports
- ◆ Data can only inform instruction if it is teacher friendly
- ◆ School principals will use tools that bring or add value

Santa Clara County SChoolPlan™

- ◆ Facilitates CDE Single Plan for Student Achievement
- ◆ Incorporates CSIS student ID system
- ◆ Meets requirements of NCLB and PSAA, including reporting to the community (SARC)
- ◆ Web based; available with web access
- ◆ Low cost to schools and districts

Reporting Capabilities and Benefits

- ◆ User friendly
- ◆ Relational and multidimensional database
- ◆ Disaggregate data by district defined subgroups
- ◆ Report multiple measures simultaneously
- ◆ Analyze data to identify root causes for student achievement gaps; power enhanced through pivot tables
- ◆ Security maintained by access level

Reporting Capabilities and Benefits

(continued)



- ◆ Data-driven and research based
- ◆ Monitor student progress by subgroup, program, class, school and district
- ◆ Customizable teacher, site, and district reports
- ◆ Input survey data/information
- ◆ Evaluate existing education improvement standards - fully standards aligned
- ◆ Store and analyze state and local data
- ◆ Supports SAIT and PI requirements

Meets Federal, State and Local Requirements

- ◆ Federal legislation - No Child Left Behind
- ◆ California legislation - Public Schools Accountability Act
- ◆ State standards - Test Blueprints
- ◆ State standards for teaching profession
- ◆ Characteristics of high achieving, effective schools

Meets Federal, State and Local Requirements (continued)

- ◆ Community review - SARC
- ◆ Charts and data displays to facilitate interpretation
- ◆ Monitor student progress, longitudinal and cohort, using vertically calibrated data
- ◆ Evaluate progress of students, schools and districts
- ◆ Maintain current Accountability Progress Reports: AYP, API and Title III AMAOs
