

Happy February! This month, we celebrate Black History Month. Additionally, this year marks the 100th anniversary of the recognition of Black history in the United States. The initiative began with Carter G. Woodson, a Harvard-trained historian, and minister Jesse E. Moorland. They founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History and sponsored a National Negro History Week in 1926. The recognition took hold in towns and cities across the United States. By the 1960s, the celebration expanded from a week to a month. In 1976, President Gerald Ford officially recognized Black History Month.



African Americans have had a tremendous impact on so many aspects of American life, and particularly on arts and culture in the United States.
