SV Creates' ArtsEdConnect Grant Applications Open Today!

The ArtsEdConnect partnership of the Santa Clara County Office of Education and SVCreates is pleased to announce that through the generosity of the Warmenhoven Family Foundation and the County of Santa Clara, arts education grants will be awarded again this school year.

The ArtsEdConnect program awards grants to eligible teachers and classrooms in public and charter schools in Santa Clara County to



support and encourage arts education in our schools. The grants are available to take students on arts field trips, bring artists into the classrooms, fund student performances, and create various art projects that foster creativity, innovation exploration, self-expression, and social and emotional learning.

Eligible educators from all levels and content areas are invited to create projects that support stand-alone arts experiences in the five arts disciplines (music, visual art, media art, dance, theater) or integrate science, technology, history, literature, or social sciences with the arts.

ArtsEdConnect 2024 - 2025 Educator Grant Options

- Arts Experiences Grant up to \$2,500 per teacher
 Grant funds can be used for classroom workshops delivered by artists, a residency with local artists, field trips, museum visits, attending live theater performances, or other similar arts experiences.
- Arts Experiences & Materials Grant up to \$3,000 per teacher
 Funds can be used for a combination of arts experiences and materials in a coherent project, for example, working with a resident artist to produce a play, including purchasing materials for costumes. There is a cap of \$500 on materials and supplies. These should be procured in support of the arts experience.

Note: You may only apply for one grant.

Important Dates

- The grant applications will be accepted Wednesday, August 14, 2024, through Wednesday,
 September 18, 2024.
- The ArtsEdConnect Grant Committee will review submitted applications and send out grant award emails by **October 14, 2024**.
- The grant funds will be disbursed between **November 15, 2024 December 15, 2024**.
- Grants must be expended by April 30, 2025, with final reports due no later than May 31, 2025.

Annual Report Extension for Arts and Music in Schools

As of Friday, July 26, 2024, Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) have extended access on the online <u>AMS web portal</u> to submit their AMS annual report as detailed in <u>California Education Code</u> <u>Chapter 5.1, Section 8820(g)(4)</u>. This functionality will remain open for submission until 11:59 p.m. on Monday, September 30, 2024. Please note this date has been updated from previous communications based on LEA feedback. Any LEA who has

already submitted the annual report through the AMS web portal may edit their report until the window closes on September 30, 2024.

Proposition 28 FAQ Updates

Please go to the Proposition 28 FAQs for the most recent updates made on July 15, 2024. The updated FAQS address topics such as funding amounts and allowances, staffing, clarifying the roles and responsibilities of the LEA and the school site, the waiver process, and accountability related to reporting requirements, the audit process, and penalites. Summer Arts Education Institute 2024

The Summer Arts Education Institute 2024 was held at Harbor High School in Santa Cruz from Monday, June 10 until Thursday, June 13, from 10:00 to 3:00 daily. It was an inspiring event with facilitators, Andres Ortiz, Lauren Yurkovich and Monica Galvan. Guest presenters included Laurel Shastri, Amalia Diaz, and Camilio Ortiz from El Sistema. Six facilitators and 23 classroom teachers and teaching artists from across the 4 counties in our region 5 gathered here in Santa Cruz to engage deeply in the various arts disciplines and to learn how to apply arts education and arts integration strategies in their classrooms! The inspiring week was full of thought-provoking dialogue, critical inquiry, creative movement, and expressive visual arts explorations. This year's themes were the "Artist Toolkit, Connection, and Abundance". We introduced examples of culturally relevant art lessons that promote socio-emotional development, and address arts integration strategies in ELD, math, and science.

A special thank you to Harbor High School for hosting us once again, and to the districts in our county and county offices of education across our Region 5 (Santa Cruz, Santa Clara, Monterey, and San Benito) that invested in this wonderful opportunity to support your classroom teachers in engaging deeply in this powerful professional development experience, gaining skills and tools to bring the arts into their classroom curriculum.







Artspiration Partner Events Directing Change - Mini-grant Opportunity

Youth Creating Change is thrilled to announce a new Mini Grant Opportunity for Bay Area schools! The mini grant program



facilitates participation in the organization's annual film contest, Directing Change, and engages youth to learn about suicide prevention, mental health, and other critical health and social justice topics by creating short films and art projects that are used to support awareness, education, and advocacy efforts across the state, in their communities, and on their campuses. This free and

evaluated curriculum has been implemented in California schools for 12 years. Students have a chance to win cash prizes and participate in an award ceremony.

Eligible Organizations: Bay Area middle schools, high schools, and school-based youthclubs. Participating youth should be in grades 6-12. Public, private, and charter schools are all eligible to apply.

Eligible counties: Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Sonoma, and Solano.

Mini Grant Funding: Up to \$1,500

Requirements:

- Facilitate participation of at least one classroom in the Directing Change curriculum during the 2024 Fall semester, resulting in a minimum of 5 film submissions to the annual suicide prevention and mental health film contest (submission deadline November 20, 2024).
- Plan and implement a mental health or suicide prevention awareness event on campus or virtually by the end of October 2024.
- Students must receive at least one lesson plan on mental health or suicide prevention taught by a member of the Youth Creating Change team by November 2024.
- Complete survey about the program.
- Submit a final report documenting mini grant activities by December 1, 2024.

In addition to the mini grant funding, the Youth Creating Change Team will provide ongoing support, including meetings with advisors and youth, reviewing storyboards, helping facilitate virtual lessons for classes, and providing feedback for the mental health or suicide prevention awareness event on campus.
