In September, 2022, Stanford Live will host a residency with the acclaimed Australian circus company Circa to produce and present their work "Leviathan." 18 members of Circa and 18 local youth and adult guest performers will engage in a structured rehearsal process in which guest performers will contribute their unique skills and personalities to the final form of the work. Innaugural Fiesta del Mariachi at the Mexican Heritage Plaza!

SAN JOSÉ, CA – On July 22 and 23, the School of Arts and Culture at MHP (SOAC) will host its inaugural Fiesta del Mariachi. This two-day event aims to share the art of mariachi customs and traditions through music workshops for youth and a concert series for community members. Nydia Rojas and Lupita Infante – two powerful women with booming voices in the mariachi world – will headline the concert.

Fiesta del Mariachi is a community-friendly event that inspires families to gather and celebrate San José's Mexican heritage through mariachi music. Workshop participants must be at least 12 years of age with three years of experience in their instrument. Registration is \$80.00, and limited financial aid is available. SOAC continues its commitment to serve as an arts and cultural hub in East San José, hosting community events and educational programs that promote local artists and arts organizations.

Workshop

Manuel Caratachea, musical director of Mariachi Tapatio, will lead the workshop direction and has more than 40 years of mariachi experience. The workshop will span over a day and a half focusing on the following instruments: violin, trumpet, guitar,



vihuela, guitarron, and harp, as well as vocals. Lunch will be provided during the program's Friday, July 22 portion only.

Concert

Community members of all ages will be able to enjoy a 3.5-hour concert series outside in La Plaza's courtyard on Saturday, July 23. Mariachi superstars, Nydia Rojas and Lupita Infante, as well as local favorites, Mariachi Azteca and Mariachi Tapatío will headline the concert. Participants enrolled in the workshop will also have an opportunity to showcase their talents with a recital during the series. We will be following county guidelines regarding Covid-19.
