Theme - My Superpower:
The Power to Imagine. The Passion to Create.

Everyone has a superpower—something that makes them unique, resilient, and extraordinary. It might be the rhythm in your music, the emotion in your performance, the movement in your dance, the vision in your art, or the message in your media. "My Superpower" invites artists across all disciplines to explore and express the inner

forces that define them. Whether it's the courage to speak out, the power of imagination, or the strength to overcome, this theme celebrates the diverse ways we channel our creativity into something powerful.

- Musicians might compose or perform pieces that reflect personal triumph or emotional depth.
- Dancers can embody strength, transformation, or identity through movement.
- Theatre artists can tell stories of hidden powers, resilience, or self-discovery.
- Visual artists can illustrate symbolic or literal interpretations of power and uniqueness.
- Media artists can craft digital narratives, animations, or films that bring their superpowers to life.

2025-26 Santa Clara County Mathematics Festival

Santa Clara County Office of Education invites you to the third annual county-wide Mathematics Festival on Saturday, October 25, 2025, from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m., taking place at the Ridder Park Office, 1290 Ridder Park Drive, San Jose,

CA 95131. Students in grades TK-8 can discover the fun and joy in mathematics by playing games and solving puzzles with family and friends!

We are also seeking volunteers to assist with the festival. Parents, educators, high school students, and members of the community are all welcome! Community service hours are available upon request.



Music & Movement in Early Learning (Pre-K to Grade 2)

Young children naturally engage in performing arts activities and artful expressions throughout their day! Experimenting with sounds and movements doesn't require any special materials. Teachers in preschool through Grade 2 often get children's attention or signal a transition with a rhythm pattern, chimes, or a rainstick.

Pre-K and TK classrooms typically have a music center where students explore simple instruments, such as jingle bells, egg shakers, maracas, sticks, and drums. Some classrooms have a "maker" station where students can create rubber band guitars on plastic food trays and simple drums with oatmeal cartons. PBS Kids offers a free professional learning video series on facilitating an integrated STEAM unit on sound for young children: PBS Kids: Sound.

The California Department of Education has just released revised Preschool/TK Learning Foundations for Visual and Performing Arts. This document articulates how educators can engage young children in visual arts, music, drama, and dance. The Kennedy Center highlights the connections between music and math. Research has shown that "preschool mathematics ability predicts mathematics achievement through age 15." More support for music educators working with young children can be found in the Children's Music Network.

2025–26 Expanding Access to Arts Education Community of Practice

The passage of the Arts and Music in Schools Funding Guarantee and Accountability Act (Prop 28) has brought increased attention to the need for the strategic use of this



and other funding streams to ensure equitable access to a sequential, standards-based arts education for all students at all grade levels.

Community of Practice participants will build their capacity for leadership in arts education by:

- Exploring opportunities for expanding access to all students, including emerging multilingual learners, students with disabilities, and students in under-resourced communities.
- Deepening understanding of various models for funding arts education.
- Sharing ideas and promising practices around arts and arts integration.
- Hearing from a variety of arts education leaders and engaging in conversations around problems of practice.

Audience: Participation is open to all county and district arts education leaders, PK-12 arts teachers, teaching artists, and community arts organizations. No cost, but advanced registration is required.
