

2025–26 Expanding Access to Arts Education Community of Practice

The passage of the Arts and Music in Schools Funding Guarantee and Accountability Act (Prop 28) has brought increased attention to the need for the strategic use of this and other funding streams to ensure equitable access to a sequential, standards-based arts education for all students at all grade levels.



Community of Practice participants will build their capacity for leadership in arts education by:

- Exploring opportunities for expanding access to all students, including emerging multilingual learners, students with disabilities, and students in under-resourced communities.
- Deepening understanding of various models for funding arts education.
- Sharing ideas and promising practices around arts and arts integration.
- Hearing from a variety of arts education leaders and engaging in conversations around problems of practice.

Audience: Participation is open to all county and district arts education leaders, PK-12 arts teachers, teaching artists, and community arts organizations. No cost, but advanced registration is required.
