Since we started tracking our student participation in Work-Based Learning, we celebrate the following accomplishments:

- Over three thousand student WBL connections have been made across 12 sectors and 9 types of learner experiences.
- This school year there were over fifteen hundred student WBL experiences, with 135 student participants in the PilotCity program.
- During the challenging times of the pandemic we were able to host three Sector Week events, in Arts, Media, and Entertainment, Information and Communication Technologies, and Health, with over 20 sessions and 600-plus live student contacts.




Kudos to the many connectors and teachers, serving more than 15 school sites, who made this happen!
