Exploring Alternative CTE Models for Alternative Education Students

What can we do to best serve incarcerated youth within our alternative education settings when the limited time does not allow for a traditional 2-3 yearlong course pathway?

At Santa Clara County Office of Education's Blue Ridge School, we are putting the emphasis on certifications and pre-apprenticeships when it comes to incarcerated students at promise. In conjunction with this "training center" approach, we are working closely with industry partners to make sure the training is relevant to labor demand, and to develop pipelines for students to enter the workforce and college programs of study with an emphasis on apprenticeships and other applied learning opportunities.
