



<u>Using Data Effectively to Improve Outcomes for CTE Students</u>

In addition to the impact Career, Technical Education (CTE) has on students' lives, it has become increasingly important for Local Education Agencies as an accountability measure. In fact, CTE's impact on the California School Dashboard's College & Career Indicator (CCI) has been increasing with the addition of more career measures that were requested by the State Board of Education, which provide more opportunities for LEAs to demonstrate how their students are "Prepared" for life beyond high school. Beyond the Dashboard, effective use of data



has become a critical component for CTE program funding, such as the Perkins Grant and the CTE Incentive Grant.





Featured Partnership

East Side Union High School District – Financial Services Independence High School Academy of Finance offers students a seamless transition from high school to community college in a



specialized pathway which leads to careers in the financial services industry. The pathway gives students the options of taking an introductory computer course and two courses that have been articulated with Mission College to give students 3 units of college credit for completing Introduction to Business and Economics of Small Business Ownership (Entrepreneurship). Through Mission College, you can obtain an AA in Accounting or Business.






