### Introducing our October College Student graduate, Gabriela Gonzalez Gomez

Hometown: From everywhere! I was born in Guatemala City, Guatemala,

raised in the Bay Area, and moved around in my teenage years.



My family moved to this country with dreams of a better future and a better education.

The idea of going to college was always just that; an idea. I never really thought about college as a tangible thing until I got to high school. Since I moved around a lot, my focus was always on adapting to the new place that I was in and not necessarily looking towards the future.

At that time, college seemed more like a looming cloud than a bright future. Although my dad has always been a huge support in all other aspects of my life, navigating college and education as a first-generation student was very difficult. It wasn't until a multicultural counselor at my school invited me on a college field trip and told me that I could go to college. He encouraged me to apply to schools and helped fill out my applications. In the end, it was a combination of all of these things that motivated me to pursue higher education. The encouragement from my counselor, the need to honor dad's sacrifices and make him proud, and my drive to prove that I could go to college despite all the challenges.

- 2. How did you choose the University of Minnesota? What factors contributed to your decision?

  I was in Minnesota at that time, and the University of Minnesota was my top choice. The U is the largest public University in the state, and I had always wanted to go to a big school in a city where I could feel like I was in a different world even if I was close to home. The campus overlooks the Mississippi River and is located both in Minneapolis and St. Paul. Once on campus, I made friends and found a support system through my adviser and student programs.
- 3. Looking back on your time at the University of Minnesota, what are you most proud of and why? I would highlight my work with Orientation & First-Year Programs. I started as an Orientation Leader and then eventually became a Parent Coordinator, where I had the opportunity to interact and support Spanish-speaking families. This experience helped me understand the schools' responsibility to provide high-quality services for families that speak a language other than English.

As a student who went through this process, what can educators do to help first-generation high school students navigate their path to college?

Make information widely accessible, regardless of your perceived notions about what students might or might not already know or that student's ability to succeed. One of the things that I ran into a lot as a first-gen student was being shamed for asking a question because it was something that "everyone should already know." Sometimes it isn't that students aren't asking questions but that they don't know what to ask.

If you could go back in time and tell your younger you something you wish you knew to help you on this journey, what would it be and why

Don't be afraid to explore your options! There are so many resources out there to help you get through this. You are not alone, don't be afraid to ask questions when you need to. In the end, it will only hurt you if you don't get the information you need. Your experiences are valid, you belong, and you are enough



### COLLEGE DAY ACTIVITY OF THE MONTH

My Career and College Dreams Collage

Ask students to create a personal collage of their possible dream jobs/careers. Suggest that they identify the first step (entry level) job for work they find interesting. They should find corresponding photos in magazines, on the computer, or create a drawing for that position. Then, they should look for pictures (or draw one) of someone in the middle of their career in this field. Finally, they should be encouraged to look for images of someone who is a master or at the top of their career. For younger students, it is useful to encourage students to connect specific jobs to "career clusters" while older students can connect career clusters, educational expectations, and salaries.

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


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
