Reuse Background

- Keuse a response to a budget dilemma
- Addressed three divergent realities
- VIncrease in Population/Service Demand
- Vincrease in facility square footage
- V Decrease in staffing/budget allocations



Making the best of a bad situation...

PRNS budget deficit led to:

- Staff and service reductions or eliminations
- Delayed openings & community center closures
- Need for revenue increases
- New or higher fees
- PRNS reorganization
- Greater program efficiencies
- New service delivery models
- Continue services in new ways (Reuse)



Brief History of Reuse

- Reuse Policy adopted on April 22, 2008
- ➤ 17 sites added in 2008
- Six sites added in 2009
- >22 sites added in 2010
- Reuse Policy revised on June 16, 2010



2010 Reuse Policy Revisions

Reuse Policy revised on June 16, 2010

- > Temporarily suspended competitive evaluation requirements
- Evaluation criteria expanded to include non-recreation
- Allow market rate facility rental fees and full or partial costcommensurate with the square footage used. sharing of maintenance and utility facility expenses
- 21 New Reuse sites added/Funded until June 30, 2011
- > Phase 1: Starbird, Gardner, Washington United, Alviso, Alum Rock, Alma
- >Phase 2: Remainder of sites: Projected November 2010 release



Reuse RFI, continued

Reuse RFI (Section 2, Page 2)

- Facilities offered in "as-is" condition
- Service Provider will provide personal property (FF&E)
- Non-exclusive use of facilities offered in some cases at no cost, in return for services that primarily benefit San José residents
- Service Providers may pay for use of facility, including maintenance/utilities based upon the level of fees charged to the public

Requirements for Submitting Proposals Minimum Qualifications (Section 7, Page 5)

- Proof of 501c (3) status
- 2. For-profit must show proof of Business License and evidence of good standing w/State of California
- Satisfactory performance in each of last five years, and shall not have been terminated for breach of City of San José agreement.



Reuse RFI, continued

Desirable Qualifications (Section 7, Page 6)

- 1. Five years experience within last 10 years
- 2. Financial sustainability, including cash on hand, for the proposed services

RFI Requirements (Section 8, Page 8)

- 1. Respond to questions in Partnership Proposal Form (Attachment A) one for each personnel.
- 2. Submit separate proposals for each facility you propose to operate
- 3. Collaborative proposals acceptable; must identify lead entity



Reuse RFI, continued

- 4. Financial and other requirements increase or decrease with proposed scope of programs and services
- City may consider quality, character, and past performance of proposer or proposer employee, with other City programs
- 6. Service Provider must maintain required insurance (Attachment B)
- 7. Service Provider must execute agreement with City of San provided with the response to the Request for Interest José. Any objections to the exemplar form should be Exemplar form can be found on Reuse website.



Rel Evaluation Criteria

Proposals evaluated based on:

- 1. Benefits to City and neighboring community, and overall feasibility of proposal to site
- 2. City will evaluate and prioritize proposals, and provide a pass/fail rating
- Evaluation may include requests for additional tollow-up information
- 4. City may request oral interviews and/or presentations
