After a day of international, national, and local speakers and presenters, the culminating event of the symposium was probably the most poignant. Here, local high school graduates and seniors and one 8th-grade student expressed what they felt were the "drivers" of their success. It was good to hear our local students confirm the findings of the Battelle for Kids study citing personalization, teacher quality, and cultural value as the most important contributors to success in school. When asked to describe the school of their own design, all spoke of the importance of the relationships inside the school walls instead of the walls themselves. When asked what made the difference for them, students spoke of personalized instruction, high expectations, and a teacher's belief that they could excel. They spoke of personal pride, school pride, and community pride each one wanting to be seen, heard, and respected for who they are and what they had to contribute. While it is always good practice to hear from those in the field who have researched, implemented, evaluated, and influenced policy in the name of eliminating the achievement gap, to truly be inspired we need look no further than our own classrooms. There we will find students waiting and wanting, waiting for us to believe in them and challenge them, wanting us to have the courage to do it now.




