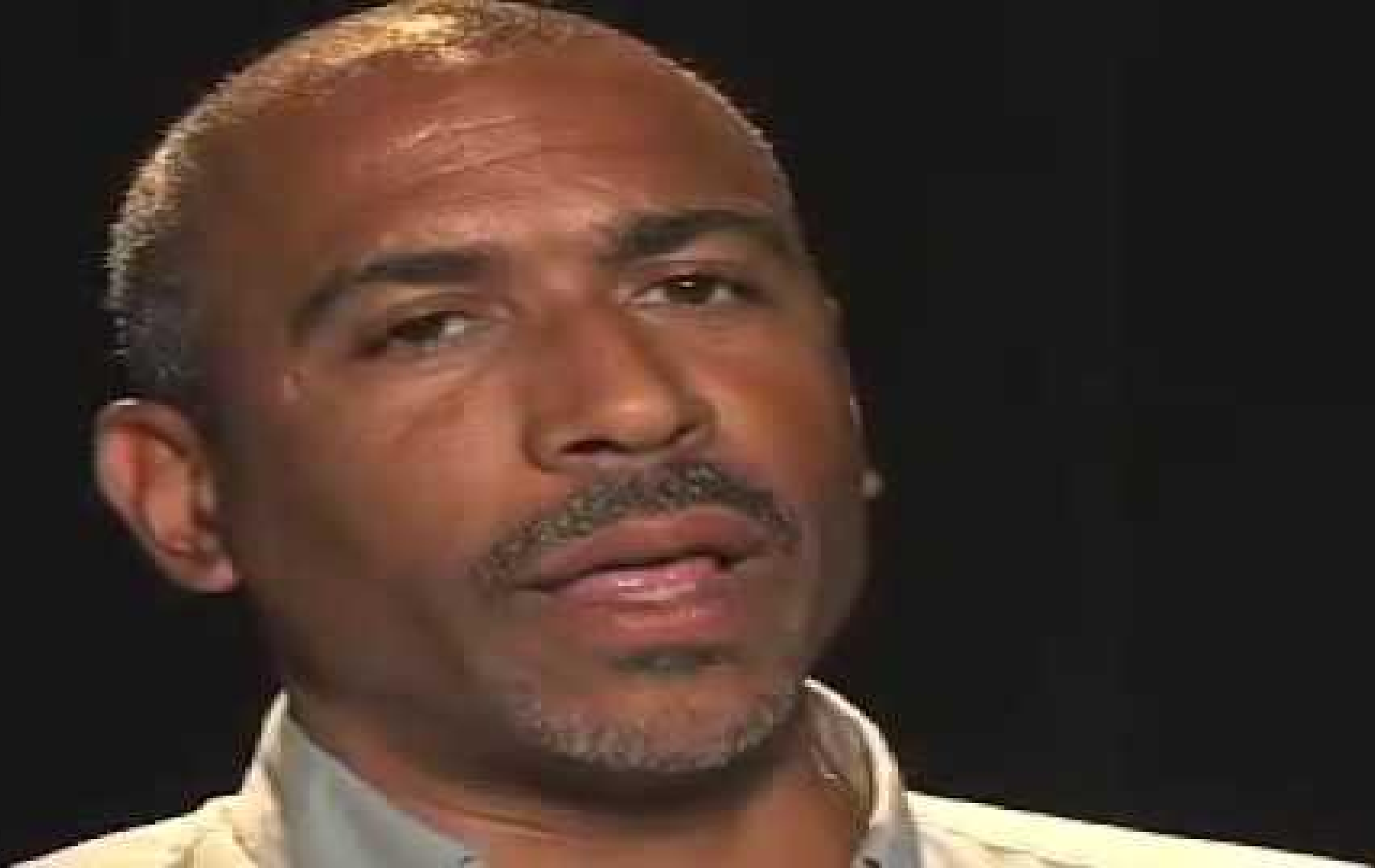

Educational Inequity

- Over one million students in the state of California attend public school in school districts where average test scores are more than a grade level below the national average
- The most and least socioeconomically advantaged districts have average performance levels more than four grade levels apart.
- Average test scores of black students are, on average, roughly two grade levels lower than those of white students in the same district; the Hispanic-white difference is roughly one- and-a-half grade levels.





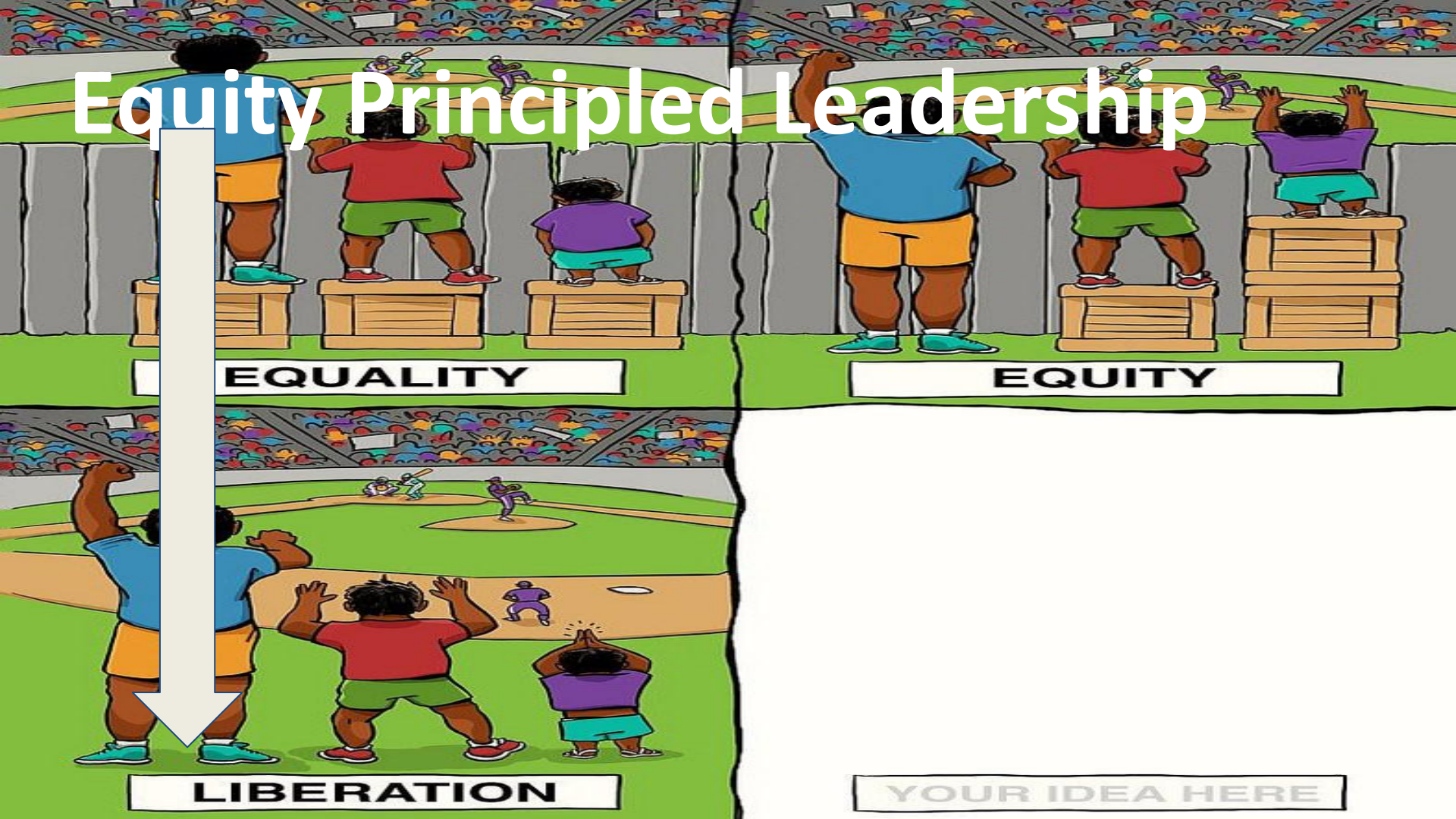

Program Application Requirements

- Applications accepted as of January 2nd, 2018, link on SCCOE website
- Must have a valid California Teaching Credential
- Must have worked in a K-12 setting 4 years
- Must have two letters of recommendation, one from immediate supervisor
- Must have letter of intent
- Must have verification of employment from HR department on district letterhead



11 Month Program

LEAP offers an 11 month program, starting August 11th and ending in mid June. The program begins with **two Saturdays in August. August 11th and the 18th. Classes begin the week of August 27th.**

Classes Offered in Cohorts

LEAP classes are organized in cohorts based on the day of the week the class is offered. **The classes are offered, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday. Saturday SCCOE and South County. Weekday classes meet once a week from 4:30p-8:00p. Saturday classes meet 2-3 times from 8:30am-3:30pm.**

Program Cost

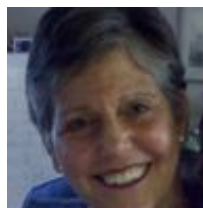
The cost of the program is \$6,500 and is paid in installments spread out over the year. (See 2018 payment schedule)

- Full implementation 2019-2020



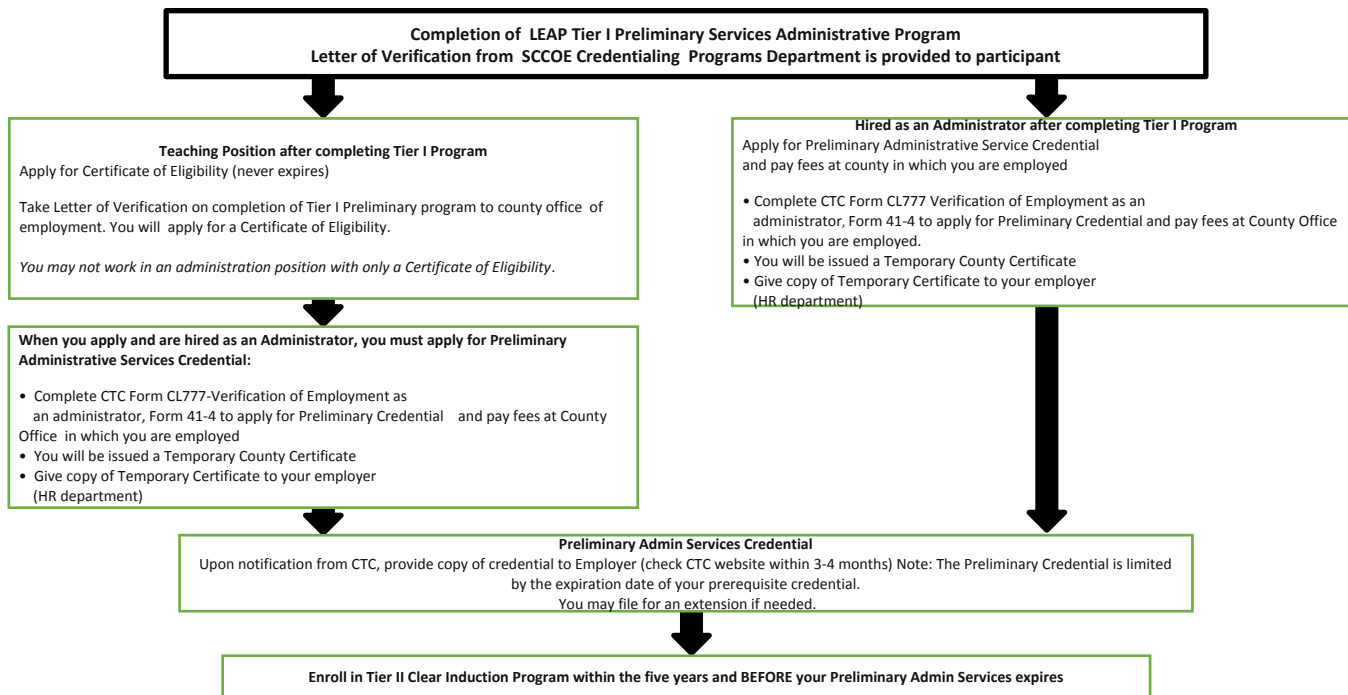
LEAP Fieldwork

- Parallel with coursework
- Applied skills from coursework
- Fieldwork Supervisor for Guidance
- Coursework and Fieldwork must be completed prior to end of program year
