CLASS TITLE: YOUTH HEALTH AND WELLNESS-COMMUNITY SCHOOLS COACH

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of an assigned supervisor, the Youth Health and Wellness-Community Schools Coach provides partnership, technical assistance, and coaching related to Community Schools planning and implementation as well as builds knowledge, expands capacity and ensures successful outcomes.

This position will work closely with various Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) and school, teachers, students, and families; partners to provide an integrated focus on academics, health and social services, youth and community development, and community engagement; guides the Community Schools towards four key pillars (1) Integrated Support Services; (2) Family and Community Engagement; (3) Collaborative Leadership and Shared Decision Making; (4) Extended/Expanded Learning Time and Opportunities.

Provides training and coaching programs for County Offices of Education, Districts, Schools and partner agencies related to Community Schools implementation.

Develops resources and participates in direct coaching to schools and LEAs.

Supports educational agencies in developing Memorandums of Understandings with partner agencies and community-based organizations that support the development of Community Schools.

Convenes and supports the site based Community Schools Leadership team and ensures community and invested partners are included in this decision making body of planning and implementation of Community Schools.

Leads and participates in Transformative Professional Learning Communities.

Develops long and short-term training plans with districts and schools; designs and delivers training modules and materials to develop content and pedagogical knowledge.

Prepares and maintains a variety of narrative and statistical reports, records and files related to personnel and assigned activities.

Itinerant location (travel required as far south as Santa Clara County, as far north as Sonoma County, as far east as Alameda County and as far west as Marin/Sonoma County)

Attends a variety of conferences, departmental and interdepartmental meetings throughout California as assigned.
