As part of California's transition to ESSA, California must submit an ESSA State Plan to the U.S. Department of Education. The State Plan will describe the State's implementation of standards, assessment, accountability, and assistance programs and will move us toward California's goal of having a single, coherent local, state, and federal education system. The California Department of Education (CDE) is committed to ensuring a transparent transition to the new law and developing an ESSA State Plan that is informed by the voices of diverse Californians.

The CDE and several county offices of education across the state are partnering to host a series of regional stakeholder meetings to provide an overview of the ESSA and an update on the development of the ESSA State Plan and to consult with stakeholders regarding what should be included in the State Plan.
