
Register for our virtual Interactive Storytelling Series with 4-online sessions designed for educators looking to engage all learners in their classroom beginning December 3.

NEVER USE WATER TO PUT OUT A GREASE FIRE/ TURN SKILLET HANDLES

- Don't use water on grease fires
 - Smother with a lid
 - Turn off the stove
- To prevent spills and burns, keep skillet handles turned to the back

Thanksgiving Cooking Safety

Cooking is the leading cause of home fires, with ranges or cooktops responsible for over half of cooking fire incidents, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). Be safe in the kitchen with these quick tips:

- Never use water on a grease fire! This can cause flames to spread. Instead, cover the fire with a lid to smother it.
- Turn the skillet handles to the back to avoid accidental spills or burns.
