  - A Ask about the presence of unsecured firearms in homes
  - R Recognize the role of firearms in suicide
  - T Tell your peers to be S-M-A-R-T
- Reviewing and sharing the <u>Safe Storage Fact Sheet</u>
- <u>Voluntarily surrendering firearms to the Sheriff's Office</u>

Together, the community can create environments where young individuals can flourish, assured of their safety.






Medi-Cal Coverage Renewal
