**Message from Dr. Mary Ann Dewan,
County Superintendent of Schools**

Dear Santa Clara County Community,

July is recognized as National Culinary Arts Month. While this is a time to celebrate food and its many joys, it is also a time to acknowledge and address food insecurity. The United States Department of Agriculture found that in 2021, over 10 percent of households in the nation were food insecure. According to Feeding America, Santa Clara County has a food insecurity rate of over 7 percent or over 130,000 people.

While this is startling, there are resources available for everyone, such as summer meals for youth. According to the United States Department of Agriculture, in both July of 2020 and 2021 the Summer Food Service Program provided over 5 million meals to youth each day.

Childhood Vaccines


