Dear Santa Clara County Community,

February is Black History Month, an opportunity to celebrate and recognize the incredible contributions of African Americans in the United States and beyond. This year's theme, *African Americans and the Arts*, highlights the influence and work the African American community has made and continues to make in the arts, specifically film, music, literature, performing arts, fashion, and more.

The California Department of Education reported that in the 2022-23 school year, **4,159** students, or **1.8%** of students in Santa Clara County, identified as African American or Black.




Kindergarten Readiness




