
Santa Clara County Early Learning Webinar







The County of Santa Clara Public Health Department's Sexual Health & Harm Reduction Program has launched the <u>2024 Viral Video Contest</u> for Santa Clara County high school-age youth. Santa Clara County high school students are encouraged to address this staggering statistic by creating a short video (30-90 seconds) that addresses the stigma around STIs and testing, encourages safer sexual practices, and promotes healthy relationships. Winning students will be awarded up to \$1,500 for themselves and \$500 for their high school. The submission deadline is March 8.
