Message from Dr. Mary Ann Dewan, County Superintendent of Schools

Dear Santa Clara County Community,

More than 2 million poisonings are reported each year to the nation's poison control centers. To mitigate the number of people, specifically children, involved in poisonings I encourage you to use National Poison Prevention Week as an educational opportunity to learn how to keep your loved ones safe.

Household items such as prescription medicine, detergent, and batteries can cause poisoning in young children and precautions should be taken to ensure their safety.

Here are some tips to ensure all young people are safe in your home:

- Store medicines and household products out of reach of children
- Install safety latches on cabinets
- Ensure medicines are properly closed and stored
- Use products in child-resistant packaging

Fentanyl can cause poisoning. People may unknowingly consume fentanyl, resulting in poisoning or overdosing. Some precautions that can be taken are understanding the signs of an overdose, carrying naloxone, and being prepared to call 9-1-




Santa Clara County Parks 2024 Summer Internships




Environmental Literacy Leadership Collaborative


Kognito Mental Health and Wellbeing Trainings
