Message from the County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Dewan

Greetings everyone,

As we continue to practice gratitude this month and in observance of Veterans Day on Wednesday, November 11, please join me in acknowledging and thanking all who have served or are currently serving in a branch of our military.

This week also brings us World Kindness Day - an opportunity to practice <u>random acts of kindness</u> - on Friday, November 13. In addition, Diwali, the ancient Hindu festival of lights, will be celebrated on Saturday, November 14th. This ancient festival represents the eternal triumph of light over darkness or the victory of good over evil.



Last week, we discussed that as a county we are currently in the Orange, or Moderate Tier, in the <u>Blueprint for a Safer Economy</u>. This tier is focused on <u>risk reduction</u> and has allowed for more businesses and activities to reopen. It is important to note that while more is available to us in this tier, it doesn't mean we can relax our efforts to stop the spread of the virus. We must remain diligent in the proper wearing of face coverings, frequent hand washing, maintaining a physical distance of more than 6 feet from others, and remembering that outdoor activities are safer than indoor. In reducing the risk of spreading the coronavirus and influenza, it is also vital to be routinely tested for COVID-19 and <u>get a flu</u> shot.

Earlier this week, the Bay Area Health Officers released <u>recommendations for safer holidays and travel</u>. The joint recommendations advise the public that if you gather in person, it is best to keep it small, short, stable, and outdoors. Also, nonessential travel, including holiday travel, is not recommended. Travel outside the Bay Area will increase your chance of getting infected and spreading the virus to others after your return. For those who are traveling, there are tips to help avoid catching COVID-19 or spreading it to fellow travelers. If you travel outside the Bay Area, it is strongly recommended that you self-quarantine for 14 days after your return if your activities while traveling put you at a higher risk of getting COVID-19.

In closing, I am grateful to have the opportunity to be able to serve our community, thank you.

Santa Clara County Office of Education COVID-19 Testing for Educators and Staff

We are pleased to announce free COVID-19 testing for Santa Clara County educators and staff is returning to the Ridder Park campus. Testing will occur in the San Jose Room from 12 - 6 p.m. on the following dates:



- Friday, November 13
- Friday, November 20
- Tuesday, November 24
- Tuesday, December 1

For educators and staff who have frequent interaction with the public, testing at least once a month is recommended. This type of COVID-19 test is a gentle and non-invasive nasal swabbing. The test is free regardless of insurance status. Insurance information will be requested but is not required, and co-pays will not be billed.

COVID-19 Testing, Safe, Quick, and Easy!

As winter quickly approaches, there is no time like the present to get tested for COVID-19!

SCCPHD offers free testing in each city in Santa Clara County one to two weekdays per month. The sites are appointment-based, allowing for a fast testing experience. The County Fairgrounds site offers large capacity appointment-based drive-through testing and is open on Saturdays. Details for each testing site and upcoming testing dates can be found at SCCFreeTest.org.

The Santa Clara County Public Health Department (SCCPHD) recommends that educators and other school staff who are working on-site, and have frequent interactions with students or the public, take a COVID-19 test and have the results prior to returning to the site. Educators and other school staff are also encouraged to participate in surveillance testing at a cadence of at least once a month. Testing can be accessed through one's healthcare facilities for more information click here. Symptom-free essential workers who are unable to receive testing from their healthcare provider can inform the SCCPHD by visiting sccCOVIDconcerns.org.

Flu Shot Clinic

Don't forget to get your flu shot to prevent you from becoming ill and spreading it to teachers, classmates, coworkers, family members, and people in your household. Shots available for everyone 3 years and older. Children between six (6) months and three (3) years old should get the flu vaccine and other scheduled vaccinations through a health care provider. Children age 3 -17 must be accompanied by a guardian.
