Message from the County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Dewan

Greetings everyone,

The holiday season is now in full swing. It is a great time to reflect and think of creative ways to build new traditions and celebrate safely. While we organize our holiday plans, we must still remember the critical importance of following health and safety protocols as defined by the new public health order. On December 3rd, Governor Newsom announced a Regional Stay-at-Home-Order which states that all sectors other than retail and essential operations shall be closed in regions of the State where less than 15% of ICU beds are available. In an urgent action driven by a need for



stricter measures to stop the spread of the virus, the Health Officers for the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco, and Santa Clara, as well as the City of Berkeley, jointly announced that they are proactively implementing the State's Regional-Stay-at-Home-Order. The Regional-Stay-at-Home-Order for Santa Clara County took effect on Sunday, December 6th. The new restrictions will remain in effect until January 4th, 2021.

It is crucial that we each do our part to stop the spread of COVID-19 and adhere to all <u>safety protocols</u>. If you must leave your home for essential items during the regional stay-at-home-order, remember to practice physical distancing of more than 6 feet, avoid crowds and/or gatherings with those outside of your household, wear a proper face mask, and wash your hands frequently. Please take time to review these public safety <u>videos</u>; it is important for everyone to be ambassadors

of safety and share this vital information with family, friends, and the community.

Resilience and strength have been hallmarks of 2020, and they have contributed to the community's perseverance, especially during times when it has been extremely challenging. Strength and resilience are also reflected in celebrations throughout the month such as Hanukkah, the eight-day winter celebration of lights in which the Jewish community commemorates the victory of the Maccabees over the Syrian Greek army, and the restoration of the Menorah. December 10th was the first night of Hanukkah this year.

Please continue to practice all of the COVID-19 risk-reduction strategies throughout this season. We are stronger together.

COVID-19 Testing, Safe, Quick, and Easy!

As winter quickly approaches, there is no time like the present to get tested for COVID-19.

The Santa Clara County Public Health Department (PHD) recommends that educators and other school staff who are working on-site, and have frequent interactions with students or the public, take a COVID-19 test and have the results prior to returning to the site. Educators and other school staff are also encouraged to participate in routine testing at a cadence of at least once a month. Testing can be accessed through one's healthcare facilities - for more information click here. Symptom-free essential workers who are unable to receive testing from their healthcare provider can inform the PHD by visiting sccCOVIDconcerns.org.

The PHD offers free testing in each city in Santa Clara County one to two weekdays per month. The sites are appointment-based, allowing for a fast testing experience. The County Fairgrounds site offers large capacity appointment-based drive-through testing and is open on Saturdays. Details for each testing site and upcoming testing dates can be found at SCCFreeTest.org.

Saturday, December 12, is the last day the flu clinic will be open. Please make sure to stop by and get a flu shot. Shots are available for everyone 3 years and older. Children between six (6) months and three (3) years old should get the flu vaccine and other scheduled vaccinations through a health care provider. Children age 3 -17 must be accompanied by a guardian.


