Message from the County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Mary Ann Dewan

Hello everyone,

Last week the County of Santa Clara Public Health Department announced criteria for lifting COVID-19 indoor mask requirements. While our county continues to see an increase in vaccination rates, three metrics established by Bay Area Health Officers must be met before mask requirements are lifted. More information can be found in the press release. Mask requirements remain in effect.

The SCCOE and all Santa Clara County schools will continue to follow state guidance and wear face-coverings in all indoor settings. California's masking guidelines in K-12 schools would not be affected by changes to local health orders.

The County of Santa Clara Public Health Department is currently offering Pfizer BioNTech single dose COVID-19 booster for those over the age of 65, individuals 18 through 64 years of age at high risk of severe disease, and individuals 18 through 64 years of age whose frequent institutional or occupational exposure puts them at higher risk. 


2021 Advisory Redistricting Commission Meetings




COVID-19 Testing at Ridder Park
