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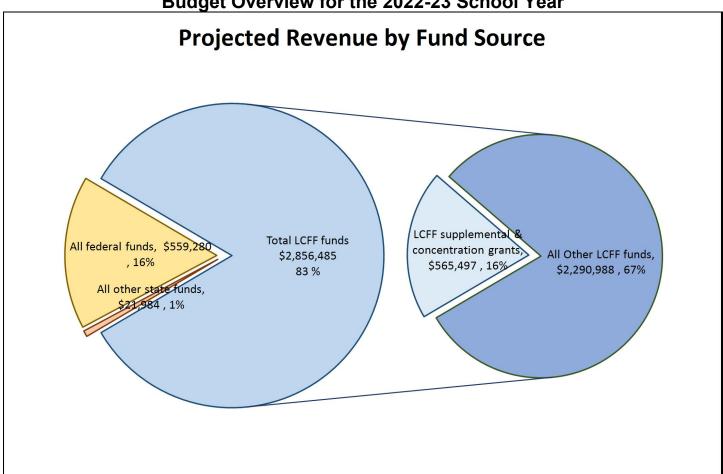

LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).





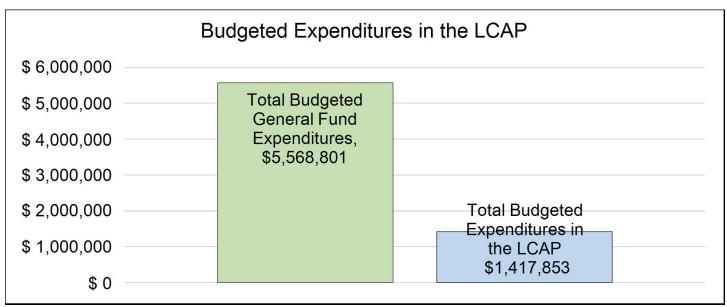
This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Opportunity Youth Academy expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Opportunity Youth Academy is \$3,437,749, of which \$2,856,485 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$21,984 is other state funds, \$0.00 is local funds, and \$559,280 is federal funds. This chart provides a quick summary of how much Opportunity Youth Academy plans to spend for 2022-23. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

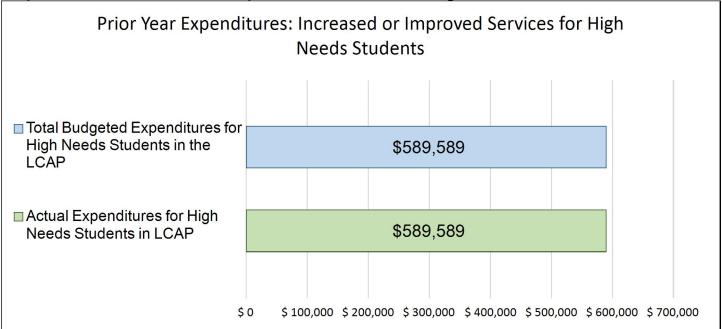
