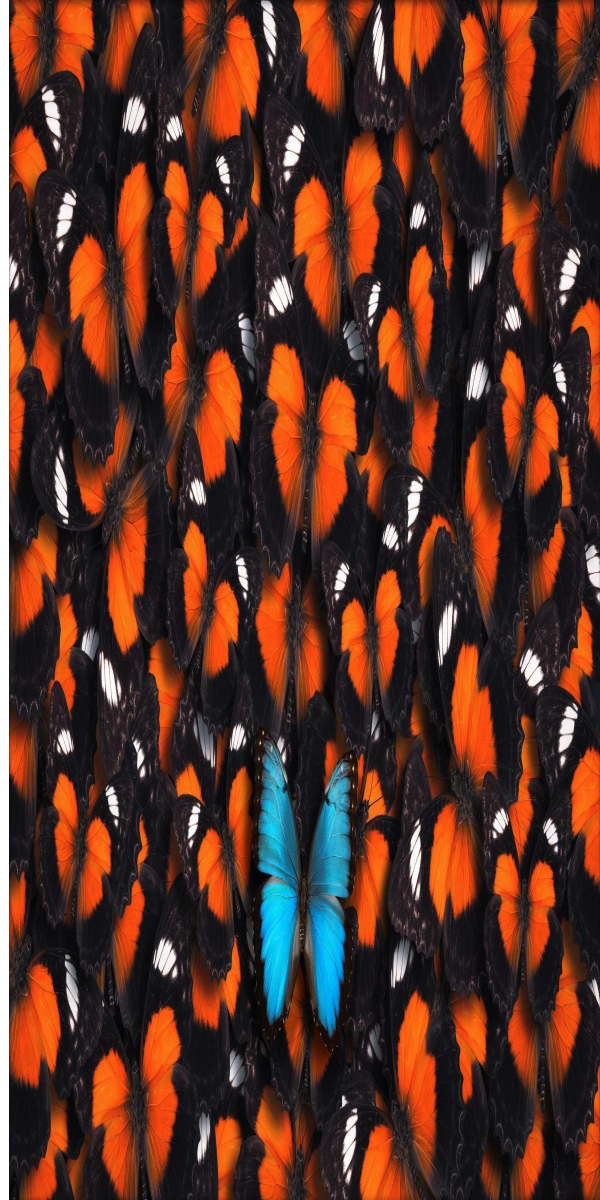


LOS REQUISITOS DE DACA (1)

- ❑ **Tener menos de 31 años de edad el 15 de junio del 2012**
- ❑ **Tener por lo menos 15 años cuando se someta la aplicación a USCIS (Inmigración)**
- ❑ **Haber llegado a los Estados Unidos antes de cumplir 16 años**

LOS REQUISITOS CONTINUADOS (2)

- ❑ **Estar en la escuela presentemente, ser graduado/a de la high school, o tener un certificado de terminación de la high school, o haber obtenido un GED**
- ❑ **Haber estado viviendo en los Estados Unidos desde el 15 de junio del 2007 hasta el tiempo presente**
- ❑ **Haber estado físicamente presente en los Estados Unidos el 15 de junio del 2012**





LOS REQUISITOS CONTINUADOS (3)

- ❑ **No tener ningún estatus legal antes de o desde el 15 de junio del 2012**
- ❑ **No tener los siguientes antecedentes penales:**
 - ❑ **Una felonía**
 - ❑ **Tres o mas delitos menores**
 - ❑ **Un delito menor que es clasificado como un delito menor significativo**
- ❑ **No ser un peligro o amenaza al gobierno de los Estados Unidos**

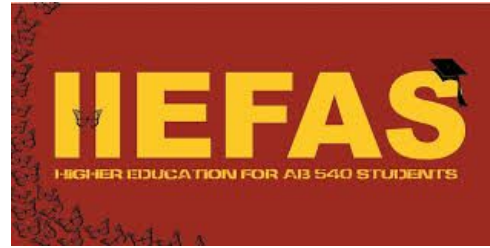

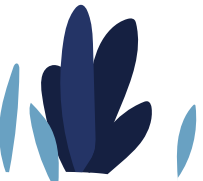

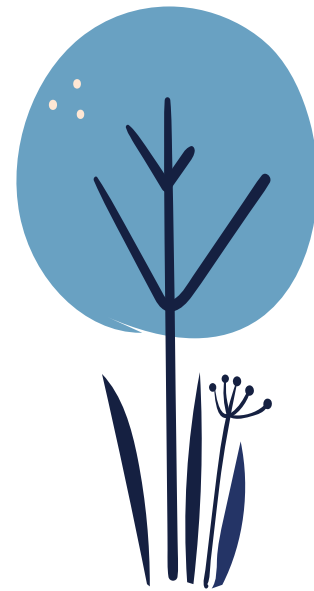

CALLING ALL role models



Working at our camps takes a special kind of person! Staff members are selected for their relevant skill and experience, their commitment and willingness to create a supportive environment for children, their ability to help deliver an overall quality camp experience, and their sense of professionalism. It is expected that all staff will support the beliefs and principles of the Girl Scout organization, including our commitment to equity, anti-racism, and belonging and that they will foster open and welcoming communities for in which all campers and camp colleagues can thrive.

CAMP BOTHIN

Just over the Golden Gate Bridge, Bothin is closest to a town, has the most modern facilities and accommodations, and serves predominantly younger, first-time campers. The weather is comfortable in the summer, usually in the 80s.

CAMP HIDDEN FALLS

Surrounded by giant California Redwoods, Hidden Falls is a sweet, small camp in the Santa Cruz Mountains near Soquel. A short hike reveals two swimmable waterfalls. The weather is comfortably warm in the summer with cooler nights.

CAMP SUGAR PINE

Our furthest camp from the Bay Area sits in an alpine setting, and is surrounded by tall pines at the foothills of the Sierra Nevadas. The weather is usually warmer in the summer, in the high 80s and drops to the low 50s at night.

Where do staff live?

Staff live in units with a group of campers in a staff bunk steps away from the camper bunks. Facilities at all of our camps are rustic, and your living arrangement may include a cabin, covered wagon, yurt, or even a hammock village depending on the location. Some housing does not have electricity and bathrooms are located a short walk away.

Do staff receive training?

Camp Staff are Youth Development Professionals. We provide a comprehensive, 12-day training session prior to the start of camp. This time is spent orienting our team to all aspects of camp and the job, including working with campers, leading activities, learning rules and regulations, specialty activity training, and understanding emergency procedures. We also spend this time settling into the rhythm of camp, growing together as a team, and discovering what makes camp so special to one another and to the campers we are about to welcome!

What will camp be like in 2021?

This summer will bring changes to the daily schedule of camp, including some job responsibilities, new or different available positions, and day-to-day impacts on the camp activities as we all do our part to keep one another safe. USCIS Now Accepting Initial DACA Applications

On December 4, 2020, a federal judge ordered the Department of Homeland Security to reinstate the original DACA program. Hence, USCIS is now accepting the following DACA applications or related forms of relief:

- Initial DACA Applications
- DACA Renewals
- Advance Parole Applications for current DACA Recipients

You may request DACA if you:

- Were under 31 years old on 06/15/2012
- Came to the U.S. before your 16th birthday
- Have continuously resided in the U.S. since 06/15/2007 until the present time
- Were physically present in the U.S. on 06/15/2012, and at the time of making your DACA request
- Had no lawful status on 06/15/2012
- Are currently in school, graduated from high school or received a certificate of completion, obtained a GED, or are an honorably discharged U.S. military veteran
- Have not been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, or three or more misdemeanors

Resource Guide for Undocumented High School Students

Know Your Rights

This guide was originally created by the United Administration under the DACA program in September 2012. Currently, the USCIS has begun accepting initial applications and the requirements to qualify for DACA are listed in this brochure.

Regardless of immigration status, there are ways you can still pursue higher education and in most cases be eligible for immigration. The most important factor to remember is there is no federal law that requires proof of citizenship status for admission or matriculation at an U.S. college or university. The federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act or FERPA, generally prohibits schools from releasing information in your educational record without your consent.

To be eligible for in-state tuition, you must meet the requirements for AB 540, SB 68, AB 2202, and CA Dream Act. AB 540 is an exemption from the payment of non-resident tuition for certain non-resident students who have attended and graduated from a high school in CA, SB 68 and AB 2000 are an extension of AB 540 that expands the local benefits to be eligible for in-state tuition. The CA Dream Act gives AB 540/AB 2000 students the right to apply for state financial aid.

Career/Technical Education

Career and technical education or vocational training prepare people to work as a technician or to take up employment in a skilled craft or trade. This is a type of educational institution specifically designed to provide hands on skills education in the fields of cooking, construction, first responders, dental assistance, mechanics, cosmetology, the tech industry, etc.

There are private and public technical schools. In public technical schools, skills can be gained without a lot of debt.

4-Year University

San Jose State University and Santa Clara University both have centers or student organizations that focus on working with undocumented AB 540 students and allies to create a space that is welcoming of all students regardless of their immigration status. At Stanford University, the BEAM program has career coaches that specialize in supporting diverse student populations including undocumented students.

All Cal State campuses provide direct immigration legal services that are free of charge to all students and employees. Appointments and packages are available to assist students with general consultations, DACA renewals and general assistance in filling out forms such as family-based petitions. Many UCs have similar programs.

Community Colleges

Community college isn't only a good option to save money but also safe and immigrant-friendly colleges. Most public community colleges in Santa Clara County offer the College Promise Program which can give you up to two years for free, including books and transportation. The following colleges have undocumented students: Foothill College, De Anza College, West Valley College, Evergreen Valley College, Mission College, and San Jose City College.

Many community colleges provide free immigration legal services, including education and outreach services, to students, staff, and faculty on California community college campuses statewide. For more information, visit: www.cccco.edu.

Mental Health Services

With the current political climate, it's important to know there are resources available to you regardless of your immigration status. Check with the college or university you plan on attending to see if you are eligible for school-based health options. See back page for mental health resources.
