

Its inquiry-based orientation invites student-centered exploration of important issues and topics, and its emphasis on 'citizenship' (broadly defined) helps make the study of history relevant to students' lives and provides a launching point for meaningful service learning and community engagement. The Framework explicitly offers several key themes for exploration throughout the curriculum, including "Haves & Have-Nots", "Uses and Abuses of Power", "Patterns of Population", and "Expressing Identity", among others.
