
Educational Testing Service is formed, merging the College Entrance
Examination Board, the Cooperative Test
Service, the Graduate Records Office, the
National Committee on Teachers Examinations and others, with huge grants from the
Rockefeller and Carnegie foundations. These testing services continued the work of eugenicists like Carl Brigham (originator of the SAT) who did research "proving" that immigrants were feeble-minded.




