Student Design Challenge Product

Educators are encouraged to submit student work such as drawing, poster, video, written proposal, and other products in a digital file. If the student work is a video, please limit the length of the video to not to exceed two minutes.

Submission Requirements

 Preschool to 12th grade student work will be submitted to SCCOE via an online submission form. Only one (1) student work submission per student or group accepted. Educators can submit the work of the entire class as one entry. <u>View</u> <u>the rubric</u>.
