MTSS Defined

- a coherent continuum of evidence based, system-wide practices;
- support a rapid response to student needs;
- frequent data-based monitoring to inform decision-making;
- empower each student to achieve their potential.

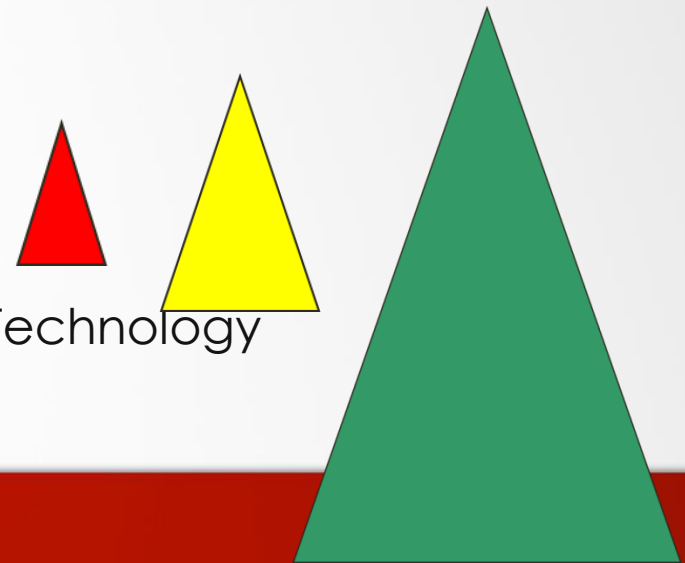

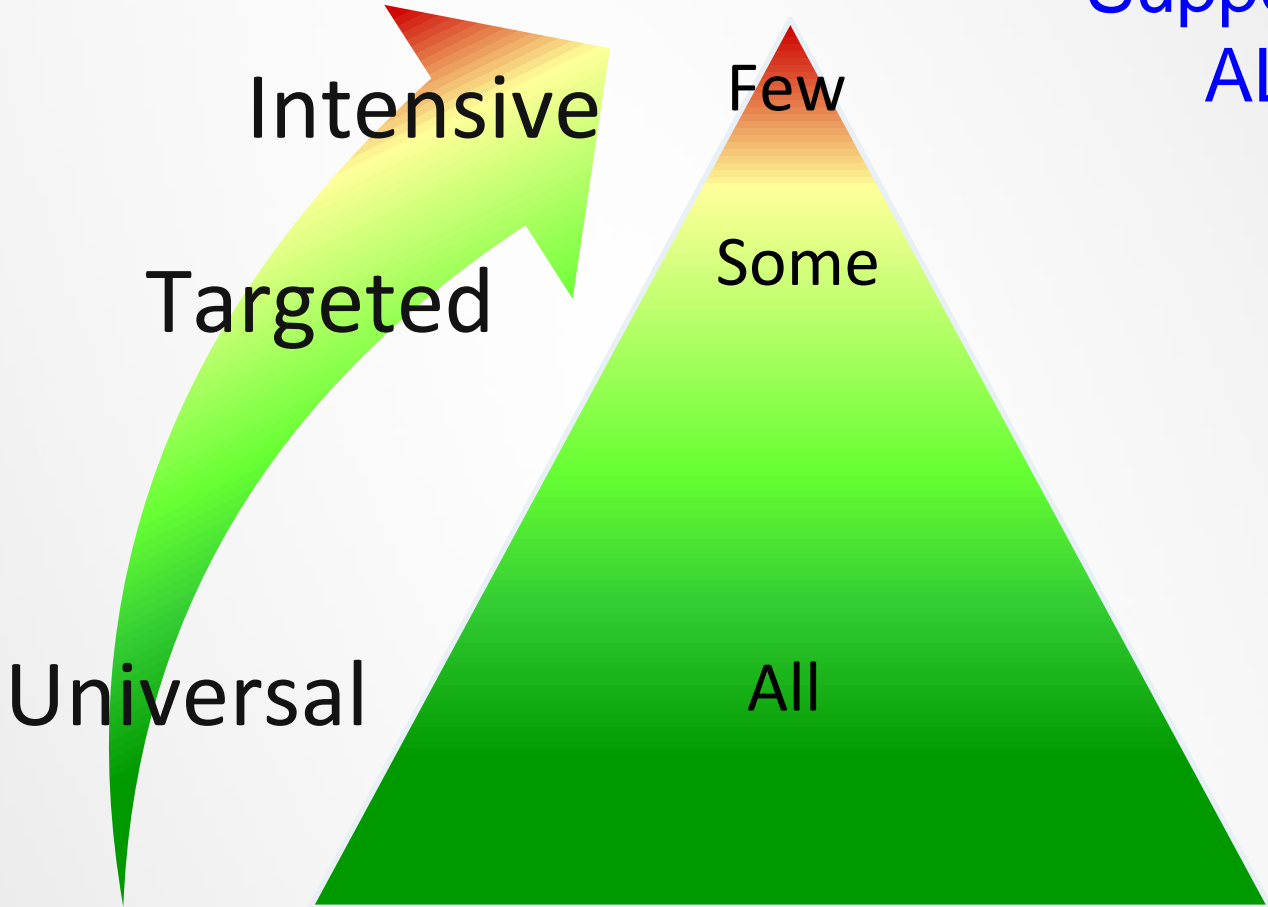


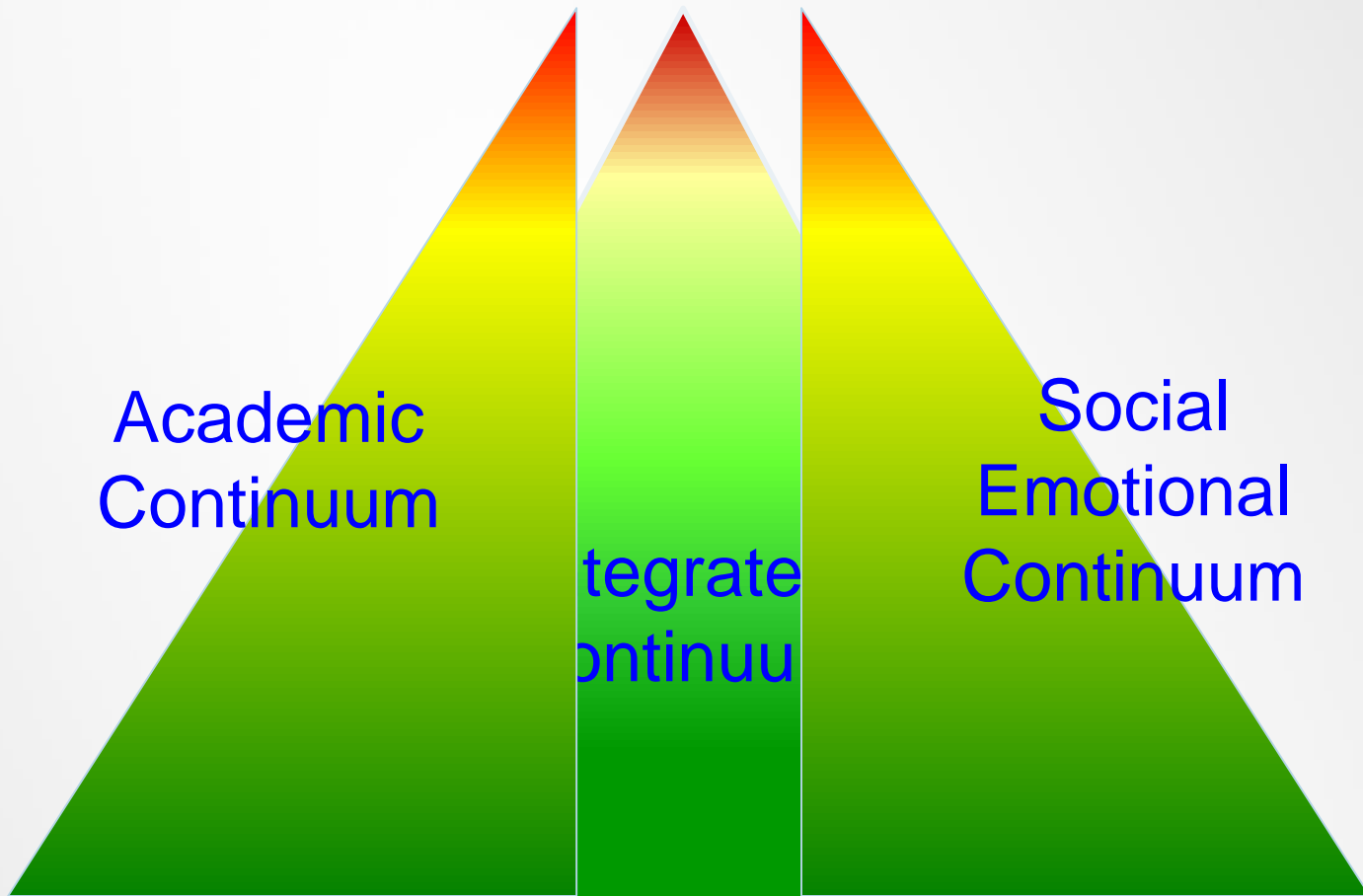
Main Messages

- Multi-tiered systems of support (MTSS)
 - Prevention first
 - One setting: Multiple levels of support intensity
 - Early intervention
 - Align academic, behavioral and social support
 - Collect and use data
 - Fidelity data
 - Impact data
 - Educational Equity
 - Programmatic and Procedural Technology



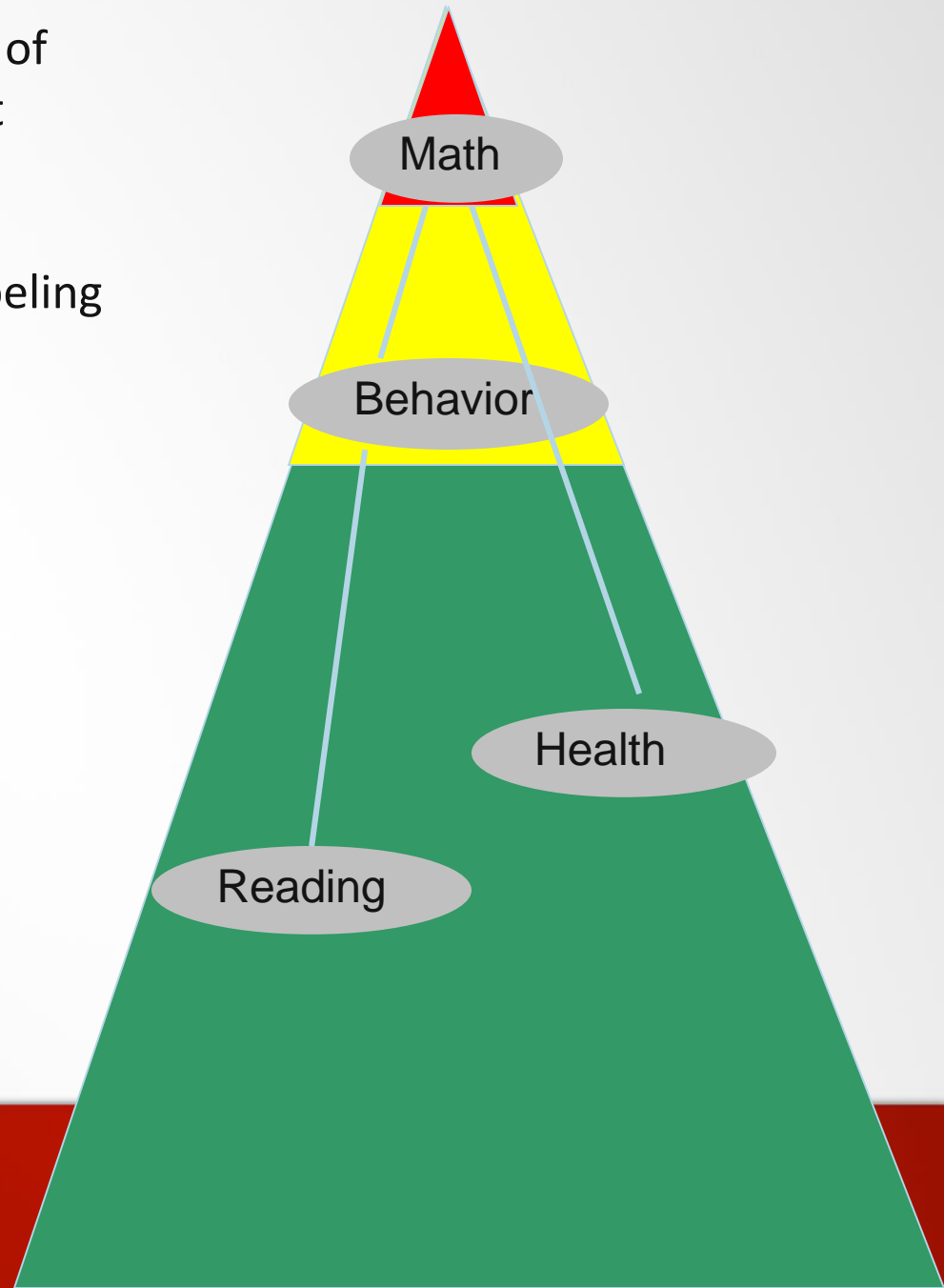
Continuum of Support for ALL

Avoid creating a new disability labeling system.

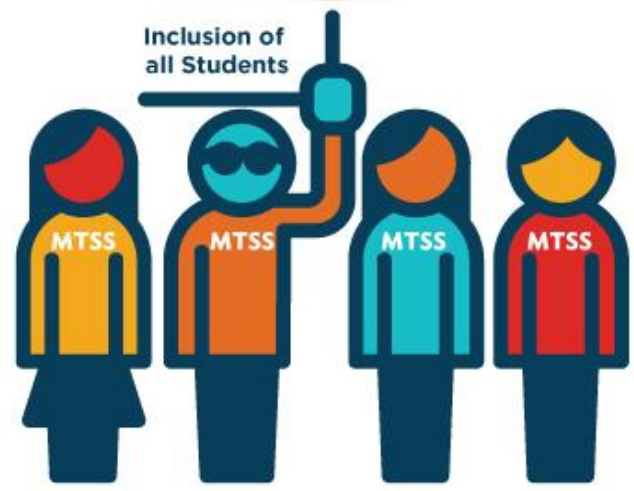

MULTI-TIERED SYSTEM OF SUPPORT

California SUMS Initiative

In April 2016, Orange County Department of Education, in partnership with Butte County Office of Education and SWIFT Education Center, was awarded a large grant to implement MTSS statewide.

California Scale-Up MTSS Statewide (SUMS) provides a process for Local Education Agencies (LEA) to assess their strengths, coordinate supports to their Local Control Accountability Plans (LCAP), and align their MTSS efforts with the eight state priorities.



Multi-tiered System of Support

Inclusive Academic Instruction

- Identify a comprehensive assessment system
- Create and utilize teams
- Provide universal academic supports
- Provide targeted interventions and supports
- Provide individualized interventions and supports
- Develop guidelines to implement curriculum with universal design for learning (UDL)

Inclusive Behavior Instruction

- Identify a comprehensive assessment system
- Create and utilize teams
- Provide universal behavior support
- Provide targeted interventions and support
- Provide individualized interventions and support
- Comprehensive social emotional development
- Provide comprehensive social emotional development support

Administrative Leadership

Strong & Engaged Site Leadership

- Lead development of a vision
- Attend instructional meetings and classes
- Create a leadership team
- Create opportunities to contribute
- Use data to guide decisions

Strong Educator Support System

- Provide access to instructional coaching
- Seek input from teachers
- Make learning opportunities available to all
- Use data
- Conduct strengths-based evaluations



Integrated Educational Framework

Fully Integrated Organizational Structure

- Identify who has access
- Use non-categorical language and practices
- Use collaborative instruction among peers
- Use paraeducators to support inclusive education

Strong & Positive School Culture

- Foster collaborative relationships
- Create a shared vision
- Identify ways for all staff to contribute
- Ensure all students have access to extra-curricular activities
- Demonstrate culturally responsive practices



Family & Community Engagement

Trusting Family Partnerships

- Engage with students and families
- Obtain input and feedback
- Provide engagement opportunities
- Facilitate home-school communication
- Provide information

Trusting Community Partnerships

- Engage with the community
- Identify mutual interests and goals
- Ensure reciprocity
- Maintain an open door policy
- Invite community members to serve



Inclusive Policy Structure & Practice

Strong LEA/School Relationship

- Develop a district-based team
- Attend school-level meetings
- Provide district-level professional learning
- Identify and remove barriers
- Regularly communicate outcomes

LEA Policy Framework

- Link multiple initiatives
- Review data
- Review and revise policy
- Select research-based practices
- Expand

Grant Information

- Grant funding in 3 Cohorts
- Funds must be encumbered by June 30, 2018 but may be expended through June 30, 2020
- Awardees in Cohorts 1-3 agree to provide outcome data through June 2020



Eligibility Requirements

Eligible applicants include:

1. One single LEA Application - Public school districts and public independent charter schools (up to \$25,000)
2. Consortium Application - Two or more LEAs applying jointly (one application) but one LEA must act as the lead (up to \$50,000)
3. LEA applicants who submit a completed application that is received by OCDE, Instructional Services Division by 5:00 p.m. on October 31, 2017.



Consortium Applications

Examples of Consortium Applications:

- COE & COE Operated Schools
- COE & District(s)
- District & Dependent Charter School(s)
- Two or more Independent Charter Schools (If Independent Charter Schools are part of the same Charter Management Organization)

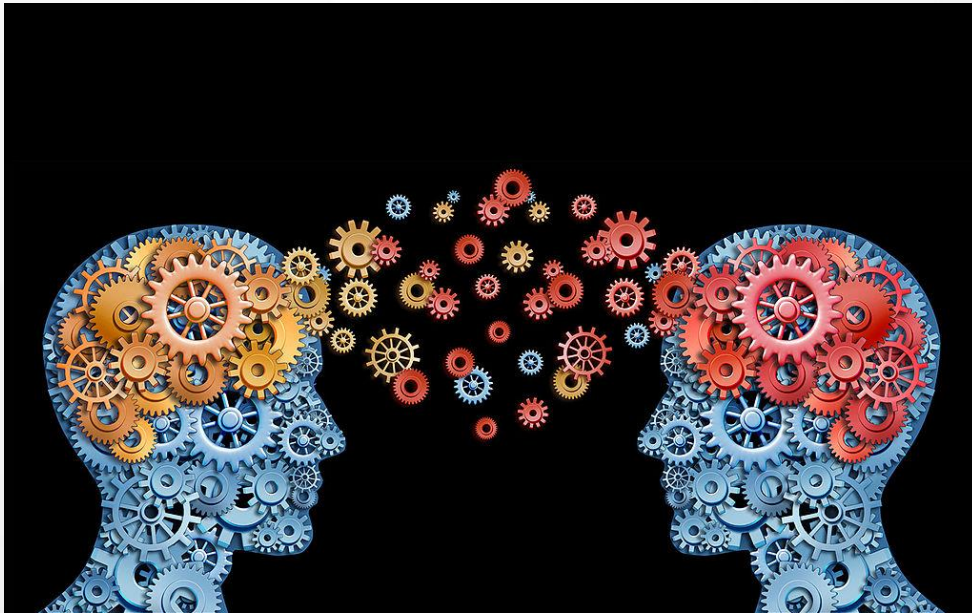
