#### What is TUPE?

- Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) is a comprehensive evidencebased program for students in grades 6th through 12th.
- The purpose is to reduce youth tobacco-use through classroom-based curriculum, youth engagement activities, one-on-one intervention support, and cessation support through referrals and quit groups.
- TUPE is endorsed by the California Department of Education and the California Department of Public Health Tobacco Control Branch.
- Funding originates from tobacco tax revenue; CA Prop 99 & 56.

## TUPE Site Coordinator Role & Expectations



#### 1. Youth Engagement •

- Recruit and retain at least 5 TUPE Peer Advocates to attend the annual Peer Advocate Training.
- Coordinate a minimum of 2 school-wide tobacco awareness activities with Peer Advocates.
- Advertise TUPE Peer Advocate events, cessation information, or other youth-related events via social media, school website, and on-campus.
- Work with TUPE Team for support and technical assistance, as needed. Communicate regularly.

#### 2. Classroom-Based TUPE Curriculum

- If designated teacher, attend TUPE curriculum trainings (Stanford Tobacco Prevention Toolkit).
- Support designated teacher(s) to deliver the curriculum to students and administer evaluation.

#### 3. Intervention & Cessation Support

- If a school counselor, attend Brief Intervention training.
- Inform and support trained staff to implement Brief Intervention.
- Share tobacco/vape cessation resources to students and school staff.
- Coordinate alternative to suspension classes or vape cessation (quit) groups, if needed.

#### 4. Professional Development & Administrative •

- Attend TUPE meetings, conferences, and trainings.
- Educate and inform school staff of the TUPE Program, services, trainings, and resources.
- Record all TUPE activities in the Activity Log.
- Check out the <u>TUPE Ideas for Spending</u> document for incentive ideas!

#### PEER ADVOCATE PROGRAM DESCRIPTION & GOALS

## Goals ©

Peer Advocates are 6th-12th grade leaders who are trained to offer peer-to-peer support to spread the tobacco and drug-free message on campus.

Be **informed** with a goal to **educate** your peers about the harms of vaping, tobacco, and cannabis use during the 2021-22 school year.

Develop skills in advocacy, public speaking, facilitation, and problem solving.

Lead your school campus to improve the **health** and **well-being** of your peers by participating in 2 school wide tobacco awareness activities by the end of the 2021-22 school year.

#### PEER ADVOCATE TRAINING

#### **Training Logistics:**

The virtual training will take place via zoom. If students are distance learning, please ensure that students are prepared and ready to participate online. If on campus, please have students in one classroom ready to go. The TUPE Team will email the zoom link and additional information before the training.

#### **Preparation:**

As site coordinators, please watch the TUPE Talk webinar before attending the virtual training. Site Coordinators must supervise their youth at all times via zoom or in the classroom to ensure a successful and smooth training.



**Important:** All students will receive their Peer Advocate Virtual Packet before the training session. All students are responsible for registering before the training.



#### PEER ADVOCATE TRAINING RECRUITMENT



We encourage you to recruit a minimum of **5** students to attend the virtual training. The Peer Advocate Program is open to all 6th -12th grade students in Santa Clara County including youth with non-traditional leadership skills and youth with lived experience.

#### **Recommendations for Recruiting Students:**

- Does your school have school loop or a social media account/website?
- Reach out to your TUPE District Lead or School's Parent Liaison for outreach support.
- Share the flyer via email to teachers and school staff.
- Encourage students to join with a friend.
- Invite past Peer Advocates to join again (ask TUPE Team for more information).
- Encourage recruited students to share the flyer on their social media accounts.
- On campus? Post the flyer around campus or in the school office. Consider making a morning announcement or post in your school's newsletter.
