

## CYBHI School-Linked Partnership Capacity Grants Allocations

The allocation augmentations will allow COEs and state special schools with 22-23 enrollment of less than 500 to request up to \$250,000 in grant funds, and COEs with 22-23 enrollment of 500 or more who have initial allocations of less than \$500,000 to request up to \$500,000 in grant funds.
