The California Arts Education Framework had its virtual launch on March 1, 2022. There was a mixture of presenters representing teachers, the different arts





- Must be a high school senior, or college freshman, sophomore, or junior enrolled in a junior or four-year accredited college or university with enrollment in an art class.
- Must submit hand drawn or painted, original artwork created by the student (no photography or digital work accepted)
- Must be recommended by an art teacher, counselor or PSWC member
- Must submit the online application, an artist statement and a portfolio of work as described on the PSWC website by April 15, 2022
