2023 Feria de Mariachi, School of Arts and Culture

Following the successful debut of Fiesta del Mariachi (FDM), the School of Arts and Culture at MHP (SOAC) is hosting its second annual celebration of regional Mexican music on July 28 and 29 at the Mexican Heritage Plaza (La Plaza). The festivities begin with an immersive day-and-a-half youth workshop led by Mariachi Tapatio's Musical Director, Manuel Caratachea, and a public Saturday concert. Mariachi Reyna de Los Ángeles, America's first all-female mariachi ensemble, headlines FDM in the heart of East San José.

School of Arts & Culture

Mexican Heritage Plaza

The inspiring group transmits its vocal power and pride through a strong and lively musical repertoire.

Choose from eight classes led by mariachi maestros; participants must be at least 12 years of age and have three years of instrument experience. Registration is \$100, and limited financial aid is available. SOAC is dedicated to empowering its community by providing a space for accessible events and educational programs and promoting local artists and arts organizations.

Workshop

Led by mariachi legend Manuel Caratachea, Mariachi Tapatio's musical director returns to contribute over 40 years of experience to youth musicians. For a day-and-a-half, the workshop will focus on the following instruments: violin, trumpet, guitar, vihuela, and guitarron, as well as vocals. Registered students will also receive free entry to Saturday evening's mariachi concert, which will also include an interactive Q&A session with America's first all-female mariachi ensemble, Reyna de Los Ángeles. La Plaza will provide lunch to students and instructors on both days.

Join us on Saturday, July 29, for the best mariachi showcase featuring Mariachi Reyna De Los Ángeles, San José's very own Mariachi Azteca, and Mexico Mariachi de Gilroy. The workshop participants will perform during the concert to showcase all they've learned.

New Research: What Works in Arts Learning

Building Arts Education Policy Using the Tools of Out-of-School Time Youth Arts Organizations Out-of-school-time arts programs in historically marginalized communities have much to teach policymakers, funders, and arts program leaders—as well as educators at large. Furthermore, the researchers of a paper in *Arts Education Policy Review* argue that the arts, and OST arts in particular, can help us reimagine ways to design learning environments that work for everyone, including our most vulnerable youth.

Researchers Erica Halverson, Kailea Saplan, Caitlin Martin and their team at the University of

them what they think works best in arts education.*

Four main categories of policy recommendations emerged out of this work:

- 1. Focus on youth and community assets
- 2. Expand beyond a program-centric model of funding and design
- 3. Support creative professionals
- 4. Rethink the design and implementation of assessment systems

Both the brief and the full paper break down the categories for four specific audiences: arts education leaders, funders, policymakers, and researchers. The findings could also have implications for others who work with young people and who are looking to expand educational equity by adapting some of the focused, caring, asset-based approaches of OST arts programs. *The team interviewed 28 arts organization leaders; 17 educators/teaching artists; 8 researchers; 9 funders and policymakers; and 10 youth artists. Organization leaders and teaching artists were from OST arts programs in nonprofit and community arts organizations; museums; school-based programs with informal educators; government agencies; and philanthropic organizations.
