





Background

- Federally funded program
- Provides supplemental educational and health services to migrant children
- Grants assist States
- Region 1 serves:



- ~ 9,059 students in 29 school districts in 6 counties
- Services are provided only to eligible students







- Professional development goals
 - Develop tools and college and career readiness interventions for Migrant students.
- Project goals
 - Create a tool for students to assist them in their high school career as they prepare for college and beyond





Project Implementation

- Pilot program at districts that currently do not have a District Service Agreement

 Rising 9th graders in summer 2014
- Follow students throughout their eligibility period to document success of MESP
 - Pre and post assessment
