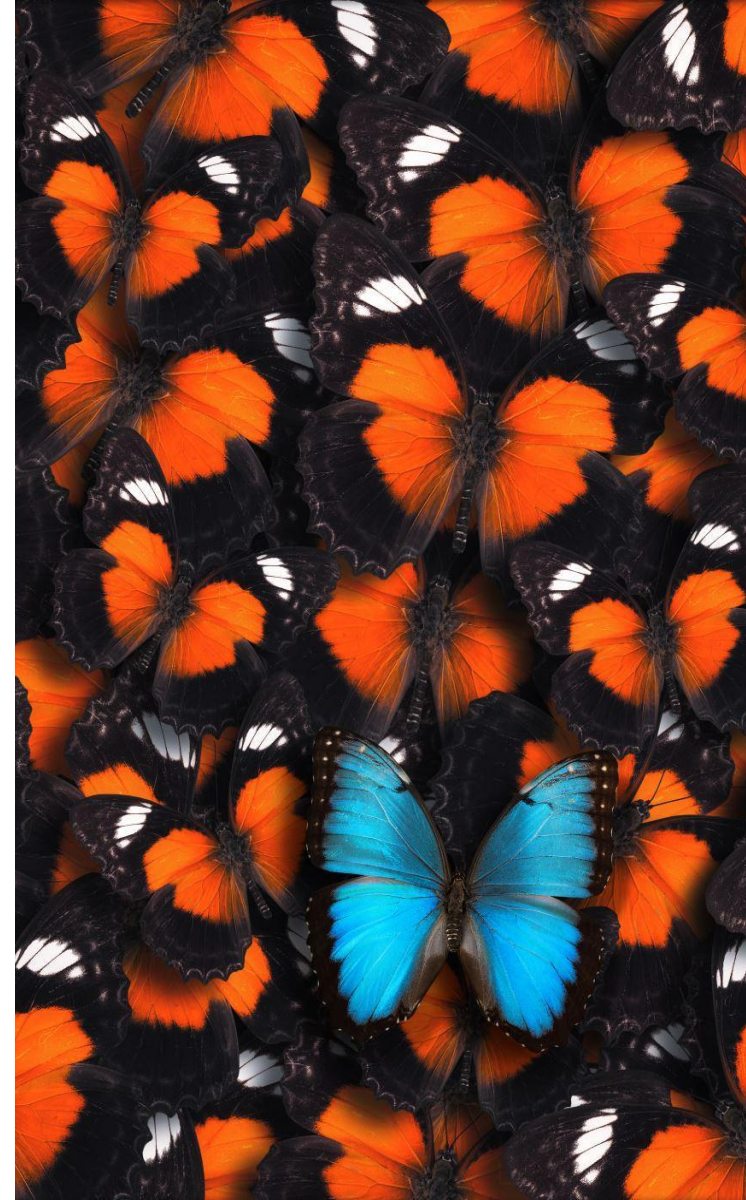
# DACA General Information

- **The filing fee for DACA initials and renewals is \$495**
- **The processing time for renewals is 2-3 months**
- **The processing time for an initial application varies, can takes 4-6 months or longer**
- **All DACA applicants will be fingerprinted and USCIS will run extensive background checks**



# DACA Thông Tin Chung

- **Phí nộp đơn DACA cho lần đầu và trở lại là \$495**
- **Thời gian làm thủ tục cho đơn trở lại là 2-3 tháng**
- **Thời gian làm thủ tục cho đơn nộp lần đầu là từ 4-6 tháng hoặc lâu hơn**
- **Tất cả người nộp đơn đều sẽ được lăn tay và được USCIS điều tra lý lịch cẩn thận.**



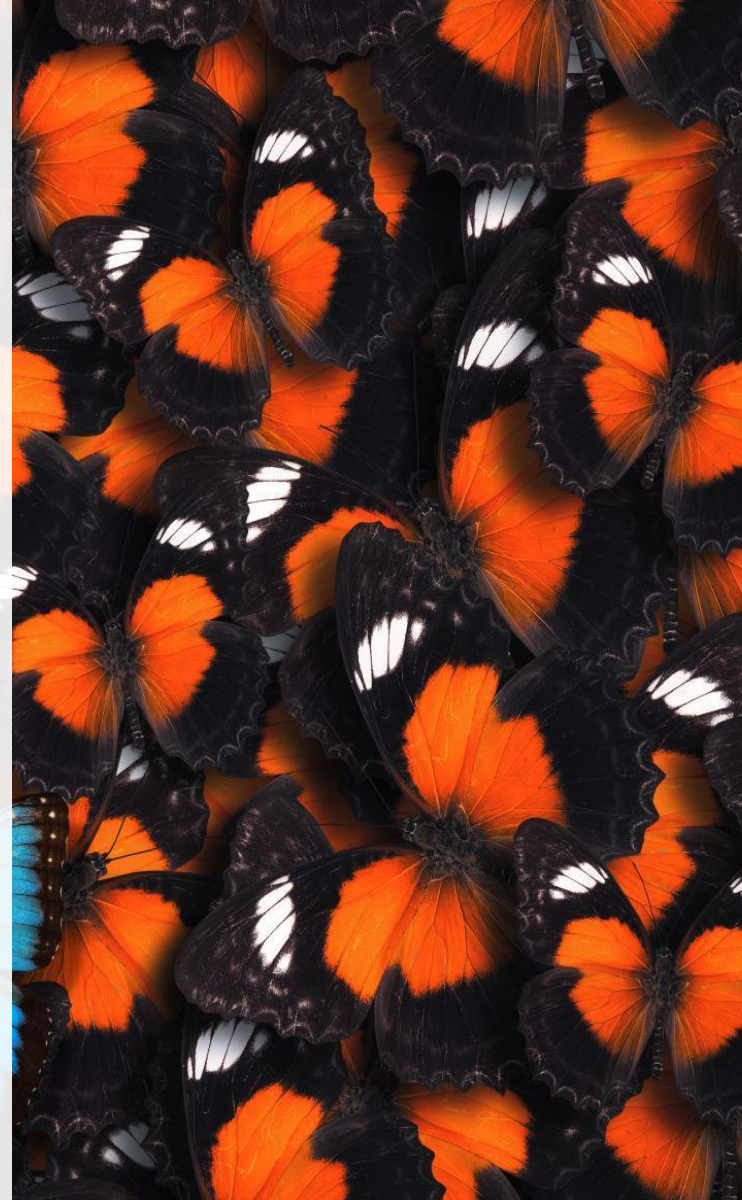
# DACA BENEFITS AND LIMITATIONS

- **BENEFITS**

- **Employment authorization (work permit) that is valid for two years and can be renewed every two years**
- **Protection from removal (deportation)**
- **You have the option to travel abroad if you need to do so for educational, employment, or humanitarian reasons**

- **LIMITATIONS**

- **DACA is temporary, not permanent relief**
- **You cannot travel abroad freely**
- **DACA can be taken away/lost**



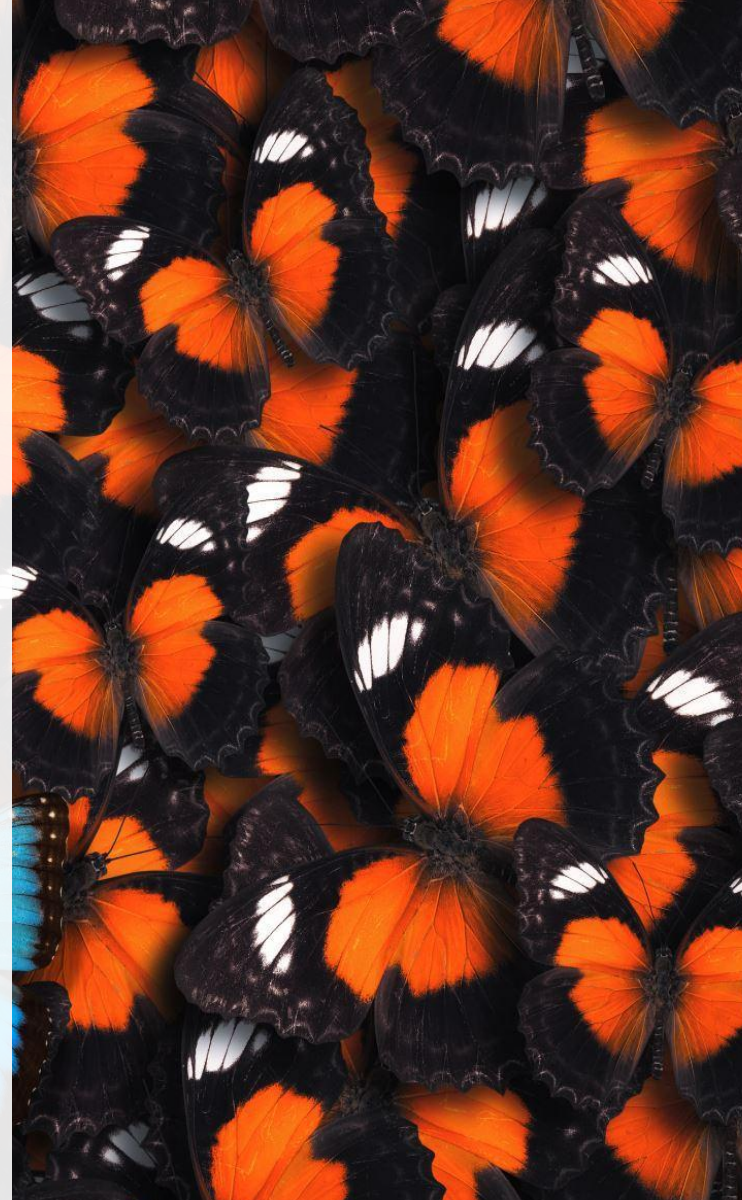
# DACA NHỮNG LỢI ÍCH VÀ HẠN CHẾ

- **LỢI ÍCH**

- **Cho phép lao động Employment authorization (giấy phép lao động) có giá trị trong hai năm và có thể được gia hạn hai năm một lần.**
- **Bạn có tùy chọn đi du lịch nước ngoài nếu bạn cần làm như vậy vì lý do giáo dục, việc làm hoặc nhân đạo**

- **HẠN CHẾ**

- **DACA chỉ là tạm thời, không phải cứu trợ vĩnh viễn**
- **Bạn không thể tùy tiện đi lại ngoài một cách tự do**
- **DACA có thể bị lấy đi/mất**







# **DACA REQUIREMENTS(1)**

- ❑ Were under the age of 31 on 06/15/2012**
- ❑ Must be at least 15 years old to submit a DACA application to USCIS**
- ❑ Must have arrived in the United States before the age of 16**

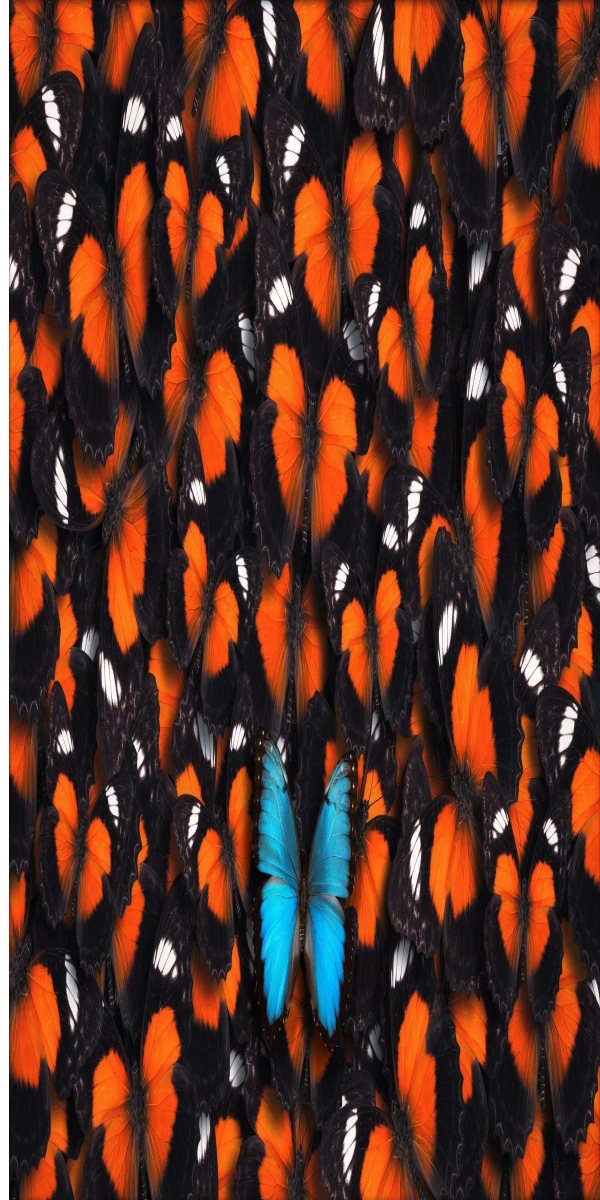

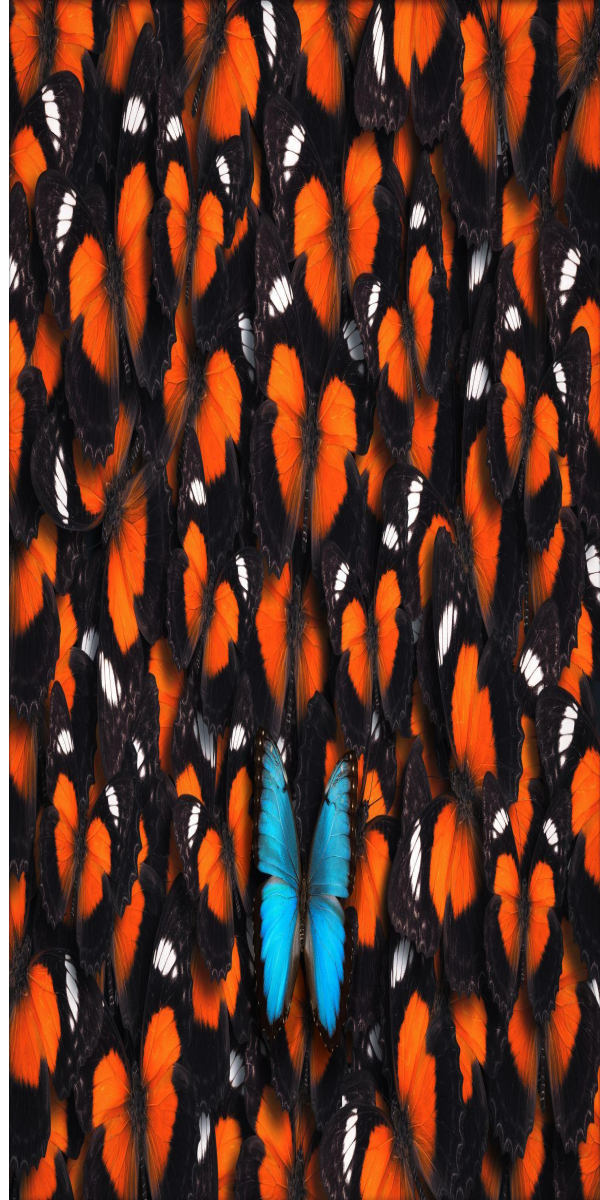
# DACA REQUIREMENTS (2)

- Are currently in school, have graduated or obtained a certificate of completion from high school, have obtained a general education development (GED) certificate, or are an honorably discharged veteran of the Coast Guard or Armed Forces of the United States**
- Have continuously resided in the United States since June 15, 2007, up to the present time**
- Were physically present in the United States on June 15, 2012, and at the time of making your request for consideration of deferred action with USCIS**



# DACA YÊU CẦU (2)

- ❑ **Hiện đang đi học, đã tốt nghiệp hoặc có chứng chỉ hoàn thành chương trình trung học phổ thông, đã đạt được chứng chỉ phát triển giáo dục phổ thông (GED), hoặc là một cựu chiến binh đã xuất ngũ danh dự của Lực lượng Cảnh Sát Biển hoặc Lực lượng Vũ Trang Hoa Kỳ**
- ❑ **Sinh sống tại United States từ Tháng Sáu 15, 2007 cho đến nay**
- ❑ **Sinh sống hiện tại United States từ Tháng Sáu 15, 2012 và vào thời điểm bạn đưa ra yêu cầu xem xét hoãn hành động với USCIS**





# **DACA REQUIREMENTS (3)**

- Have no lawful status as of 06/15/2012**
- Have not been convicted of:**
  - ONE felony**
  - THREE or more misdemeanors**
  - ONE significant misdemeanor**
- Applicant cannot otherwise pose a threat to national security or public safety**

## CALLING ALL role models



Working at our camps takes a special kind of person! Staff members are selected for their relevant skill and experience, their commitment and willingness to create a supportive environment for children, their ability to help deliver an overall quality camp experience, and their sense of professionalism. It is expected that all staff will support the beliefs and principles of the Girl Scout organization, including our commitment to equity, anti-racism, and belonging and that they will foster open and welcoming communities for in which all campers and camp colleagues can thrive.

### CAMP BOTHIN

Just over the Golden Gate Bridge, Bothin is closest to a town, has the most modern facilities and accommodations, and serves predominantly younger, first-time campers. The weather is comfortable in the summer, usually in the 80s.

### CAMP HIDDEN FALLS

Surrounded by giant California Redwoods, Hidden Falls is a sweet, small camp in the Santa Cruz Mountains near Soquel. A short hike reveals two swimmable waterfalls. The weather is comfortably warm in the summer with cooler nights.

### CAMP SUGAR PINE

Our furthest camp from the Bay Area sits in an alpine setting, and is surrounded by tall pines at the foothills of the Sierra Nevadas. The weather is usually warmer in the summer, in the high 80s and drops to the low 50s at night.

### Where do staff live?

Staff live in units with a group of campers in a staff bunk steps away from the camper bunks. Facilities at all of our camps are rustic, and your living arrangement may include a cabin, covered wagon, yurt, or even a hammock village depending on the location. Some housing does not have electricity and bathrooms are located a short walk away.

### Do staff receive training?

Camp Staff are Youth Development Professionals. We provide a comprehensive, 12-day training session prior to the start of camp. This time is spent orienting our team to all aspects of camp and the job, including working with campers, leading activities, learning rules and regulations, specialty activity training, and understanding emergency procedures. We also spend this time settling into the rhythm of camp, growing together as a team, and discovering what makes camp so special to one another and to the campers we are about to welcome!

### What will camp be like in 2021?

This summer will bring changes to the daily schedule of camp, including some job responsibilities, new or different available positions, and day-to-day impacts on the camp activities as we all do our part to keep one another safe. **USCIS Now Accepting Initial DACA Applications**

On December 4, 2020, a federal judge ordered the Department of Homeland Security to reinstate the original DACA program. Hence, USCIS is now accepting the following DACA applications or related forms of relief:

- Initial DACA Applications
- DACA Renewals
- Advance Parole Applications for current DACA Recipients

You may request DACA if you:

- Were under 31 years old on 06/15/2012
- Came to the U.S. before your 18th birthday
- Have continuously resided in the U.S. since 06/15/2007 until the present time
- Were physically present in the U.S. on 06/15/2012 and at the time of making your DACA request
- Had no lawful status on 06/15/2012
- Are currently in school, graduated from high school or received a certificate of completion, obtained a GED, or are an honorably discharged U.S. military veteran
- Have not been convicted of a felony, significant misdemeanor, or three or more misdemeanors

**Know Your Rights**

The process was originally... (text continues)

**Career/Technical Education**

Career and technical education or vocational training prepare people to work as a technician or to take up employment in a skilled craft or trade. This is a type of educational institution specifically designed to provide hands on skills education in the fields of cooking, sanitation, first responders, mental assistance, mechanics, cosmetology, the tech industry, etc.

There are private and public technical schools, its public technical schools, skills can be gained without a lot of debt.

**4-Year University**

San Jose State University and Santa Clara University both have centers or student organizations that focus on working with undocumented I-986 students and often to create a space that is welcoming of all students regardless of their immigration status. At Stanford University, one BSN program has career coaches that specialize in supporting diverse student populations including undocumented students.

**Scholarships**

San Jose State University provides three money awards (USDA, CalWORKS, and Pell) to a list of a few students who are still eligible to receive the Pell Grant's resources in conjunction with the University's Undocumented Students and Allies Association (USUASA).

All Cal State campuses provide stress immigration legal services that are free of charge to I-986 students and parents. Advisors and paralegals are available to assist students with general consultations, DACA renewals and general assistance in filling out forms such as family-based petitions. Many UCSJ have similar programs.

**Community Colleges**

Community college isn't only a good option to save money but also safe and immigrant-friendly colleges. Most public community colleges in Santa Clara County offer the College Promise Program which can give you up to two years for free, including books and transportation. The following colleges have undocumented students: Foothill College, De Anza College, West Valley College, Evergreen Valley College, Mission College, and San Jose City College.

Many community colleges provide free immigration legal services, including education and outreach services to students, staff, and faculty on California community college campuses statewide. For more information, visit: [www.ccc.edu](http://www.ccc.edu)

**Mental Health Services**

With the current political climate, it's important to know there are resources available to you regardless of your immigration status. Check with the college or university you plan on attending to see if you are eligible for school based health options. See back page for mental health resources.
