Overall readiness profile




50% were proficient in <u>all</u> building blocks

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

Characteristics and experiences linked to readiness

In addition to child and family demographic characteristics, **school readiness was predicted by several malleable assets,** including early childhood education (ECE) attendance, coming to school well-rested and well-fed, and child resiliency.

Also, although Latino boys had the lowest readiness scores overall, the presence of such malleable assets narrowed the readiness gap.
