Community Advisory Committee (CAC)

What is CAC?

The Community Advisory Committee (CAC) is made up of parents, educators, and community members who are involved in special education. Santa Clara SELPA III CAC conducts meetings and special events throughout the year and advises the SELPA Governing Board (SELPA III Executive Council of Superintendents).

CAC Membership

CAC members include parents of students with disabilities, students and adults with disabilities, parents of students without disabilities, general education teacher, special education teachers and other school personnel, representatives from other agencies, and other persons concerned with the needs of students with exceptional needs.

The members of the CAC are appointed by, and responsible to, the governing board of each participating local education agency in Santa Clara SELPA III. If you wish to be considered for a board-appointed, voting position in the CAC, please contact the Director of Special Education in your child's district of residence.

CAC Responsibilities

- Advise the SELPA Governing Board
- Recommend annual priorities to be addressed by the SELPA.
- Assist in parent education and in recruiting parents and other volunteers
- Encourage community involvement.
- Support activities on behalf of individuals with exceptional needs.
- Assist in parent awareness of the importance of regular school attendance.
- Support community involvement in parent advisory committee to encourage the inclusion of parents of individuals with exceptional needs

Why is it worth your time to attend CAC meetings?

Parents who have attended Community Advisory Committee meetings report that they have found opportunities to:

- Connect with other parents and with school district teachers and administrators,
- Learn about resources for their child and family,
- Participate in shaping the activities of the committee, including conversations with school district staff and administrators, parent workshops, an awards ceremony, and
- Develop and expand their leadership skills.

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How Can CAC help?

Attending CAC events gives parents a chance to meet other parents of children with special needs to obtain support and resources. During the year, CAC will promote a variety of events.
