The Santa Clara County Board of Education (SCCBOE) is the elected governing body of the Santa Clara County Office of Education (SCCOE). The SCCBOE works with the County Superintendent to develop sound educational policies and ensure the solvency of the SCCOE. Together, they are a strong and cohesive team that helps the SCCOE continuously set and achieve new levels of service and excellence. The Trustees are elected from different regions of the county and serve four-year terms.



A Message from the Santa Clara County Board of Education and the Superintendent

In 1992, the California lawmakers passed a law allowing charter schools to operate. California was the second state to pass legislation allowing charters (Minnesota was the first). Charter schools are public schools that get funding from the state and have flexibility in hiring, curriculum, management and other aspects of their operations.

The Santa Clara Board of Education (County Board) is granted the authority in California Education Code to approve or deny charter school petitions on appeal from a school district and to authorize countywide charter schools. This past year 23 County Board authorized charter schools were in operation providing instructional services to over 9,863 students. The County Board has been consistent in its desire to ensure students and families have high-quality school choice options that meet the needs of our diverse community.

The Santa Clara County Office of Education (SCCOE) remains committed to serving, inspiring and promoting student and public school success. One of our primary goals is to "improve student equity and access to high-quality education." In support of this effort, the County Office of Education has invested resources to establish a team of experienced educators to assist with oversight and monitoring requirements.

This fifth edition of our Annual Charter School Data Book (2017-2018) provides a measure of accountability and oversight of charter schools. This publication highlights information of vital interest to the performance and progress of the SCCOE Board authorized charter schools. The information and data provided has been obtained from the California Department of Education and the respective charter schools. Where appropriate, (2016-2017) demographic and student performance data from the California Department of Education (Dataquest) was utilized. Individual charter schools were also able to present updated data as of February 1, 2018.

With a focus on collaboration, growth, and sharing best practice, our office continues to encourage opportunities for charter schools and traditional public schools to network and learn from one another. In November 2017, the SCCOE Charter Schools Department hosted a two-day Public Choice Schools Symposium to highlight programs of choice across the districts and in Santa Clara County and a SCCBOE special meeting (materials available at www.sccoe.org/supoffice/charter-schools-office/Pages/default. aspx). Participants engaged in critical discussions of educational issues through panel presentations, seminars, site visits, and workshops.

The Santa Clara County Office of Education engages thoughtfully with the education community with equity and inclusion as our focus.






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
Charter Schools Enrollment

2016-2017 Student Performance

Based on the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), which was passed in 2013, California has a new accountability system that is based on multiple measures. These measures are used to determine Local Educational Agency (LEA) and school progress toward meeting the needs of their students. The measures are based on factors that contribute to a quality education, including high school graduation rates, college/career readiness, student test scores, English Learner (EL) progress, suspension rates, and parent engagement. Performance on these multiple measures will be reported through the new California School Dashboard. The tables below reflect the year to year student performance in ELA and Math on the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments for the past three years.

The new accountability system reflects a clear expectation that all LEAs and schools can and should improve and emphasizes equity by focusing on student group performance. This new multiple measures system replaces the former Academic Performance Index (API), which was based solely on testing results, and the federal requirement to calculate Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).

As public schools, charter schools are required to enroll and serve students with disabilities in the same manner as traditional public schools. In 2016-2017 seven charter schools used the SCCOE for Special Education purposes, with the delivery of Special Education services coordinated and monitored by the SCCOE. The remaining fourteen schools are Local Education Agencies (LEAs) for Special Education purposes and members of the El Dorado Charter Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA), which is directly responsible for Special Education services with oversight by the El Dorado SELPA. Two charter schools are LEAs for Special Education services with oversight by the Sonoma County Office of Education. Overall, 865 students with IEP's (9.0%) were in charter schools. The percentage of students with Individualized Education Plans (IEP) enrolled in these schools range from a low of 2.4 in UPA to a high of 21.2 at ACE Empower Academy.


Annual Teacher Attrition Rate

Legislative Intent

The provisions enabling charter schools in California were established by the "Charter Schools Act of 1992." The legislative intent is defined in Education Code 47601.

Education Code 47601

It is the intent of the Legislature, in enacting this part, to provide opportunities for teachers, parents, pupils, and community members to establish and maintain schools that operate independently from the existing school district structure, as a method to accomplish all of the following:

- (a) Improve pupil learning.
- (b) Increase learning opportunities for all pupils, with special emphasis on expanded learning experiences for pupils who are identified as academically low achieving.
- (c) Encourage the use of different and innovative teaching methods.
- (d) Create new professional opportunities for teachers, including the opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the school site.
- (e) Provide parents and pupils with expanded choices in the types of educational opportunities that are available within the public school system.
- (f) Hold the schools established under this part accountable for meeting measurable pupil outcomes, and provide the schools with a method to change from rule-based to performance-based accountability systems.
- (g) Provide vigorous competition within the public school system to stimulate continual improvement.

Nonsectarian, non-discriminatory, no tuition

Charter schools are free public schools and are required to be nonsectarian and are prohibited from engaging in discriminatory practices as defined by law and cannot charge tuition. These provisions are found in Education Code 47605(d)(1).

Education Code 47605(d)(1)

In addition to any other requirement imposed under this part, a charter school shall be nonsectarian in its programs, admission policies, employment practices, and all other operations, shall not charge tuition, and shall not discriminate against any pupil on the basis of the characteristics listed in Section 220.

Charter Petition Review and Approval or Denial

The provisions regarding charter petition review and decisions are found in Education Code 47605(b)(1-6). These provisions state the legislative intent that "the establishment of charter schools should be encouraged" and require the finding of one or more factors in order to deny a charter petition. In order to deny a petition, the authorizing board must find one or more of the following facts:

- The charter school presents an unsound educational program for the pupils to be enrolled in the charter school.
- The petitioners are demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.
- The petition does not contain the number of signatures required.
- The petition does not contain an affirmation of each of the required conditions.
- The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of the required elements.
- The petition does not contain a declaration of whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public employer of the employees of the charter school for purposes of EERA (Educational Employee Relations Act) (Chapter 10.7 (commencing with Section 3540) of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code).

Education Code 47605(b)(1-6)

In reviewing petitions for the establishment of charter schools pursuant to this section, the chartering authority shall be guided by the intent of the Legislature that charter schools are and should become an integral part of the California educational system and that establishment of charter schools should be encouraged. The governing board of the school district shall grant a charter for the operation of a school under this part if it is satisfied that granting the charter is consistent with sound educational practice. The governing board of the school district shall not deny a petition for the establishment of a charter school unless it makes written factual findings, specific to the particular petition, setting forth specific facts to support one or more of the following findings:

- (1) The charter school presents an unsound educational program for the pupils to be enrolled in the charter school.
- (2) The petitioners are demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.
- (3) The petition does not contain the number of signatures required by subdivision (a).
- (4) The petition does not contain an affirmation of each of the conditions described in subdivision (d).

- (5) The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of all the required elements (A-O):
- (6) The petition does not contain a declaration of whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public employer of the employees of the charter school for purposes of Chapter 10.7 (commencing with Section 3540) of Division 4 of Title 1 of Government Code.
- (A) (i) The educational program of the charter school, designed, among other things, to identify those whom the school is attempting to educate, what it means to be an "educated person" in the 21st century, and how learning best occurs. The goals identified in that program shall include the objective of enabling pupils to become self-motivated, competent, and lifelong learners.
 - (ii) The annual goals for the charter school, for all pupils and for each subgroup of pupils identified pursuant to Section 52052, to be achieved in the state priorities, as described in subdivision (d) of Section 52060, that apply for the grade levels served, or the nature of the program operated, by the charter school, and specific annual actions to achieve those goals. A charter petition may identify additional school priorities, the goals for the school priorities, and the specific annual actions to achieve those goals.
 - (iii) If the proposed school will serve high school pupils, the manner in which the charter school will inform parents about the transferability of courses to other public high schools and the eligibility of courses to meet college entrance requirements. Courses offered by the charter school that are accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges may be considered transferable and courses approved by the University of California or the California State University as creditable under the "A" to "G" admissions criteria may be considered to meet college entrance requirements.
- (B) The measurable pupil outcomes identified for use by the charter school. "Pupil outcomes," for purposes of this part, means the extent to which all pupils of the school demonstrate that they have attained the skills, knowledge, and attitudes specified as goals in the school's educational program. Pupil outcomes shall include outcomes that address increases in pupil academic achievement both schoolwide and for all groups of pupils served by the charter school, as that term is defined in subparagraph (B) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of Section 47607. The pupil outcomes shall align with the state priorities, as described in subdivision (d) of Section 52060, that apply for the grade levels served, or the nature of the program operated, by the charter school.
- (C) The method by which pupil progress in meeting those pupil outcomes is to be measured. To the extent practicable, the method for measuring pupil outcomes for state priorities shall be consistent with the way information is reported on a school accountability report card.
- (D) The governance structure of the school, including, but not limited to, the process to be followed by the school to ensure parental involvement.
- (E) The qualifications to be met by individuals to be employed by the charter school.
- (F) The procedures that the charter school will follow to ensure the health and safety of pupils and staff. These procedures shall include the requirement that each employee of the school furnish it with a criminal record summary as described in Section 44237.
- (G) The means by which the school will achieve a racial and ethnic balance among its pupils that is reflective of the general population residing within the territorial jurisdiction of the school district to which the charter petition is submitted.
- (H) Admission policies and procedures, consistent with subdivision (d).
- (I) The manner in which annual, independent financial audits shall be conducted, which shall employ generally accepted accounting principles, and the manner in which audit exceptions and deficiencies shall be resolved to the satisfaction of the chartering authority.
- (J) The procedures by which pupils can be suspended or expelled from the charter school for disciplinary reasons or otherwise involuntarily removed from the charter school for any reason. These procedures, at a minimum, shall include an explanation of how the charter school will comply with federal and state constitutional procedural and substantive due process requirements that is consistent with all of the following:
 - (i) For suspensions of fewer than 10 days, provide oral or written notice of the charges against the pupil and, if the pupil denies the charges, an explanation of the evidence that supports the charges and an opportunity for the pupil to present his or her side of the story.
 - (ii) For suspensions of 10 days or more and all other expulsions for disciplinary reasons, both of the following:
 - (I) Provide timely, written notice of the charges against the pupil and an explanation of the pupil's basic rights.
 - (II) Provide a hearing adjudicated by a neutral officer within a reasonable number of days at which the pupil has a fair opportunity to present testimony, evidence, and witnesses and confront and cross-examine

adverse witnesses, and at which the pupil has the right to bring legal counsel or an advocate.

- (iii) Contain a clear statement that no pupil shall be involuntarily removed by the charter school for any reason unless the parent or guardian of the pupil has been provided written notice of intent to remove the pupil no less than five schooldays before the effective date of the action. The written notice shall be in the native language of the pupil or the pupil's parent or guardian or, if the pupil is a foster child or youth or a homeless child or youth, the pupil's educational rights holder, and shall inform him or her of the right to initiate the procedures specified in clause (ii) before the effective date of the action. If the pupil's parent, guardian, or educational rights holder initiates the procedures specified in clause (ii), the pupil shall remain enrolled and shall not be removed until the charter school issues a final decision. For purposes of this clause, "involuntarily removed" includes disenrolled, dismissed, transferred, or terminated, but does not include suspensions specified in clauses (i) and (ii).
- (K) The manner by which staff members of the charter schools will be covered by the State Teachers' Retirement System, the Public Employees' Retirement System, or federal social security.
- (L) The public school attendance alternatives for pupils residing within the school district who choose not to attend charter schools.
- (M) The rights of any employee of the school district upon leaving the employment of the school district to work in a charter school, and of any rights of return to the school district after employment at a charter school.
- (N) The procedures to be followed by the charter school and the entity granting the charter to resolve disputes relating to provisions of the charter.
- (O) The procedures to be used if the charter school closes. The procedures shall ensure a final audit of the school to determine the disposition of all assets and liabilities of the charter school, including plans for disposing of any net assets and for the maintenance and transfer of pupil records.

Charter Petition Denial and Appeal

Charter petitions that are denied can be appealed. Petitions denied by a local school board can be submitted on appeal to the County Board of Education and petitions denied by the county board of education can be submitted on appeal to the State Board of Education. These provisions are found in Education Code 47605(j)(1).

Education Code 47605(j)(1)

If the governing board of a school district denies a petition, the petitioner may elect to submit the petition for the establishment of a charter school to the County Board of Education. The County Board of Education shall review the petition pursuant to subdivision (b). If the petitioner elects to submit a petition for establishment of a charter school to the County Board of Education and the County Board of Education denies the petition, the petitioner may file a petition for establishment of a charter school with the state board, and the state board may approve the petition, in accordance with Education Code 47605(b).

Petitions to the County Board of Education

Charter petitions may be submitted directly to the County Board of Education for charter schools that propose to serve students for whom the county office of education would otherwise be responsible for serving ("county-like") or for a charter school that would offer services that could not be provided by a charter school that operates in only one school district in the county. These provisions are found in Education Code sections 47605.5 and 47605.6

Education Code 47605.5

A petition may be submitted directly to a county board of education in the same manner as set forth in Section 47605 for charter schools that will serve pupils for whom the county office of education would otherwise be responsible for providing direct education and related services. Any denial of a petition shall be subject to the same process for any other county board of education denial of a charter school petition pursuant to this part.

Education Code 47605.6

(a) (1) In addition to the authority provided by Section 47605.5, a county board of education may also approve a petition for the operation of a charter school that operates at one or more sites within the geographic boundaries of the county and that provides instructional services that are not generally provided by a county office of education. A county board of education may approve a countywide charter only if it finds, in addition to the other requirements of this section, that the educational services to be provided by the charter school will offer services to a pupil population that will benefit from those services and that cannot be served as well by a charter school that operates in only one school district in the county. A petition for the establishment of a countywide charter

school pursuant to this subdivision may be circulated throughout the county by any one or more persons seeking to establish the charter school.

- (b) No later than 60 days after receiving a petition, the county board of education shall hold a public hearing on the provisions of the charter, at which time the county board of education shall consider the level of support for the petition by teachers, parents or guardians, and the school districts where the charter school petitioner proposes to place the school facilities. Following review of the petition and the public hearing, the county board of education shall either grant or deny the charter within 90 days of receipt of the petition. However, this date may be extended for an additional 30 days if both parties agree to the extension. A county board of education may impose any additional requirements beyond those required by this section that it considers necessary for the sound operation of a countywide charter school. A county board of education may grant a charter for the operation of a school under this part only if the board is satisfied that granting the charter is consistent with sound educational practice and that the charter school has reasonable justification for why it could not be established by petition to a school district pursuant to Education Code Section 47605. The county board of education shall deny a petition of the renewal of a charter school if the board finds one or more of the following:
 - (1) The charter school presents an unsound educational program for the pupils to be enrolled in the charter school.
 - (2) The petitioners are demonstrably unlikely to successfully implement the program set forth in the petition.
 - (3) The petition does not contain the number of signatures required by subdivision (a).
 - (4) The petition does not contain an affirmation of each of the conditions described in subdivision (d).
 - (5) The petition does not contain reasonably comprehensive descriptions of all of the charter elements.
 - (6) A declaration of whether or not the charter school shall be deemed the exclusive public school employer of the employees of the charter school for purposes of the Educational Employment Relations Act (Chapter 10.7 (commencing with Section 3540) of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code).
 - (7) Any other basis that the county board of education finds justifies the denial of the petition.

Charter Renewal

The terms of a charter and charter renewal are covered in Education Code 47607. A charter may be initially granted for a period of up to five years, and may be renewed at the end of that term. Each renewal shall be for a period of five years. The California legislature has identified specific academic criteria that must be satisfied in order for a charter to be reviewed. These criteria are found in Education Code 47607(b).

Education Code 47607

- (b) Commencing on January 1, 2005, or after a charter school has been in operation for four years, whichever date occurs later, a charter school shall meet at least one of the following criteria before receiving a charter renewal pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (a):
 - (1) Attained its Academic Performance Index (API) growth target in the prior year or in two of the last three years both schoolwide and for all groups of pupils served by the charter school.
 - (2) Ranked in deciles 4 to 10, inclusive, on the API in the prior year or in two of the last three years.
 - (3) Ranked in deciles 4 to 10, inclusive, on the API for a demographically comparable school in the prior year or in two of the last three years.
 - (4) (A) The entity that granted the charter determines that the academic performance of the charter school is at least equal to the academic performance of the public schools that the charter school pupils would otherwise have been required to attend, as well as the academic performance of the schools in the school district in which the charter school is located, taking into account the composition of the pupil population that is served at the charter school.
- (B) The determination made pursuant to this paragraph shall be based upon all of the following:
 - (i) Documented and clear and convincing data.
 - (ii) Pupil achievement data from assessments, including, but not limited to, the Standardized Testing and Reporting Program established by Article 4 (commencing with Section 60640) of Chapter 5 of Part 33 for demographically similar pupil populations in the comparison schools.
 - (iii) Information submitted by the charter school.
